LUTON'S weakness is in the attack, and in the perverse nature of things, this is the department in which they are collecting most injuries. When Walden broke his collarbone 14 minutes from the end Luton said goodbye to one, maybe both points.

At that stage, Luton had been staging a revival following an equaliser by Turner, but with the departure of Walden Oldham who had impressed in the first-half, swept back to the attack.

But even so their winning goal five minutes from the end came in surprising fashion because Ledger caught Bramwell napping by nipping in quickly to head through a corner from Johnstone.

The first goal came after 25 minutes. With the Luton defence lined up for free kick outside the penalty area Ledger jumped over the ball which was crashed in by Whitaker, and it flew off Fincham into the roof of the net.
