AFTER trailing 1—0 at half-time, Bridgwater staged an heroic assault that it seemed might save the game.

The Western Leaguers were not over-awed by their Third Division opponents. Settling down on the greasy pitch quickly they produced some first-rate passing moves that rattled the experienced Luton defence.
