

NO METHOD IN THIS LUTON SIDE

WALSALL gave their best performance of the season when beating Luton before the second lowest post war attendance. Full of confidence, they recorded their second successive home win and if they had not eased off they might have doubled their score.

Luton appeared to be a side without method, and their half-backs were rarely in the game. Their Walsall counterparts on the other hand provided the sort of service that forwards thrive upon.

Energetically led by Wiggin, they frequently outwitted the Luton defence, and only the brilliance of former England goalkeeper Baynham kept the score down.

Wiggin put Walsall ahead in the 21st minute and seven minutes later Fincham put the ball through his own goal to give the home side a two goal interval lead.

In the 56th minute Wiggin got his second goal and 13 minutes later Foster completed the scoring.
