Club Notes

OF necessity, because of the holiday, these notes had to be written before the result of the team's match at Millwall on Boxing Day was known.

The visit to 'The Den' after an absence of so many years, was not expected to be easy and this represented our last chance of gaining an away League win in 1963.

The points secured from Reading last Saturday were more than welcome and, curiously, we were more on top while Reading had their full complement of players than we were after Colin Meldrum had been led off the field with a badly sprained ankle.

Such were the difficulty of the conditions that most players finished the match with bruises, caused by heavy falls on the bone-hard ground.

There was a considerable amount of praise for the way in which 18 years old John O'Rourke took his first chance in the League side.

Had his luck really been in, he would have had at least a couple of goals to mark the occasion and it took a couple of smart saves by Wilkie to prevent him opening his account.

On this showing, John can be a great asset to us in our attempt to step up the scoring power of the attack and he looks like having a long run in the limelight.

Another who made a highly satisfactory debut was Colin Tinsley, who has been giving some fine displays in the Reserves and who proved a very able deputy for the injured Ron Baynham.

Incidentally, Baynham proved the quality of his club spirit by volunteering to play for the Reserves and so allow

young Fiore to appear for the youth team in their important Cup-tie with Limbury O.B.

This match provided a handsome win for us and it was notable for the fact that Mick Forsyth scored three times for the third week running.

There is some highly promising material for the future in this team and we are hoping that they will have a long run in the F.A. Youth Cup.

Today, we welcome Millwall, who, despite their lowly placing in the League, have an experienced team. Well-known to Town supporters are two members of their forward line, the Eire International, Joe Haverty, who returned to London after a spell with Blackburn Rovers and Pat Terry who has also seen service with Northampton, Gillingham and Charlton.

Another player who is no stranger to our team is the former Portsmouth and Blackpool centre half, Brian Snowdon who went to The Den recently.

Their new manager is Billy Gray, who played against us in the 1959 Cup Final whilst he was with Nottingham Forest. If he is as successful in the managerial chair as he was on the field as a winger, an inside forward and, latterly, a full back, then the Millwall fortunes will take a turn for the better.

This is a desperately important game for both clubs and we can only hope that we will end 1963 on a winning note and so look forward to better things in the New Year.

First task of 1964 will be the Cup visit to Fulham next Saturday. Tickets have been going quite briskly and we hope to take with us our biggest following for some time.
