Club Notes

SO very nearly last Saturday, we came to bringing to an end an unprecedented run of not a single League victory away from home in nearly 15 months.

Just 120 seconds separated us at Coventry from breaking this unwanted record and it was scant consolation afterwards that the Coventry officials thought that we had been unlucky.

Unfortunately, we are having to face up to the blunt fact that the Fourth Division is yawning before our eyes, but there are high hopes that if the team will show the fighting spirit that was evident at Coventry, we shall escape the drop.

Obviously, the real testing point will come today and next Saturday, with Colchester United and Mansfield Town as our visitors.

Neither has played at Kenilworth Road previously and, first of all, we bid a hearty welcome to Colchester, who are one of the few clubs who have managed to rise from amateur status to Football League membership.

In recent years, they have had to struggle in the face of falling support, a circumstance with which we are only too familiar this season but, nevertheless they have managed to get together a more than useful side.

Considerable credit for this can be traced to the shrewd managership of Benny Fenton, who has now taken charge at Leyton Orient and has been replaced by Neil Franklin, former England and Stoke City star, who last played against us when wearing the colours of Hull City.

Neil came back from an overseas engagement to join Colchester and met with the cold douche of a home Cup defeat on the first day on which he met the team. However, that has been shrugged off and Colchester have a good recent record which has given them a worry free position in the League table.

From now on, every game is of vast importance to us and all we can hope is that the new confidence and goal hunger, as expressed at Coventry, will continue.

On the same optimistic note, it is worthy of record that the Reserves showed a welcome return to winning form with a 4-1 win over Shrewsbury Town last Saturday, but today, they had no chance to continue in that groove because they were confronted with a blank date.

Relegation here, too, is something that we have to fight against but, in the case of both senior teams, there are real signs that there is full realisation that the fight is on and that the implications are only too well realised by the players.

On a brighter note, there is the success of the youth team who won themselves a lot of admirers by the way in which they disposed of Northampton in the F.A. Youth Cup.

That landed them in the last 16 but, unfortunately, the draw has been unkind to them because they have to travel to meet the winners of the tie between Stoke City and Port Vale, with the next round to be decided by February 15.

Some years ago, the youth team had to travel to Stoke and, in difficult
