Club Notes

FROM the publicity in the press, supporters will be fully aware of the changes that have taken place on the Board of the club during this week.

Change, of course, is inevitable, and there are times when they bring with them a swing in the opposite direction. Now, Mr. T. Hodgson, a former captain of the club, and a director for the last seven years takes over as Chairman.

Coming up to five years ago, he led the team on to the field at Wembley and we can only hope that he will have better luck at this critical stage in our history than he did on that day.

If enthusiasm and hard work is to be the remedy for our present position, then there is no doubt that our new Chairman will qualify for success.

More than that, he has the full backing of the Board and Mr. Mitchell, who has come in for much ill-informed and totally unnecessary criticism these last months, has promised to throw the whole weight of his considerable experience and support behind Mr. Hodgson.

There has been a section of the public which has said that they will not attend any more matches at Kenilworth Road until there has been a change of Chairmanship. Well, here is the challenge, and we shall be watching the turnstile figures with rather more than usual interest today.

Internal affairs have taken up a considerable amount of time and interest recently, but it is on the field that the future status of the Club will be decided.

Results of the last two matches have led us to hope that we shall be able to avoid the dreaded drop to the Fourth

Division, but from now on, it must be all-out endeavour from all concerned. Today, Mansfield Town are making their first ever appearance on this ground and we hope to improve on the draw we achieved on their ground early in the season.

Unfortunately, we shall be without Gordon Turner, who is again our leading scorer, and his place has been filled by switching Harry Walden and bringing in Jim Weir, who joined us from Mansfield in September.

Weir's last appearance in the team was against Reading in the Cup on December 7th and, since then, disappointed at his failure to achieve a regular place, he has gone on to the transfer list at his own request.

So, today, comes his opportunity, either to impress another club who might be interested, or to clinch for himself at least an extended run in the League side. For him it is a big chance and Manager Bill Harvey is obviously playing a hunch that Weir can do well against his former colleagues, rather than finding another solution to this particular problem.

Do not forget that next Wednesday, Kick-off 7.30 p.m., our successful youth team will be seen on this ground against Charlton Athletic in the replayed semi-final of the South Eastern Counties' League Cup.

Today, eight of our players, six of whom are regulars in our youth team are playing for Bedfordshire against Suffolk in the F.A. County Youth Cup at Felixstowe but, nevertheless, we are fielding a representative team in a League fixture at Bexleyheath today.
