Brentford 2, Luton 6

Brentford were a disjointed outfit and in attack only Mark Lazarus looked efficient.

For all that, with Luton wasting chance, Brentford probably deserved their goal lead at halftime, if only for the bite in their breakaways. One quick move by Lazarus sent Billy McAdams away to score.

What a difference in the second half! From the restart Harry Walden equalised, and within five minutes O'Rourke popped up right on the line to beat Willie Smith to the ball

equalised. Within minutes a beautiful free-kick by John Bramwell from near the half-way line signalled the transformation.

The ball floated towards goal and live wire O'Rourke headed in. And when Mike Block trundled a pitfully slow pass back to goalthere he was again to pounce and score his third.

Alan Jones took over from Brodie and had at least four good saves, but O'Rourke and Walden beat him easily to make it six
