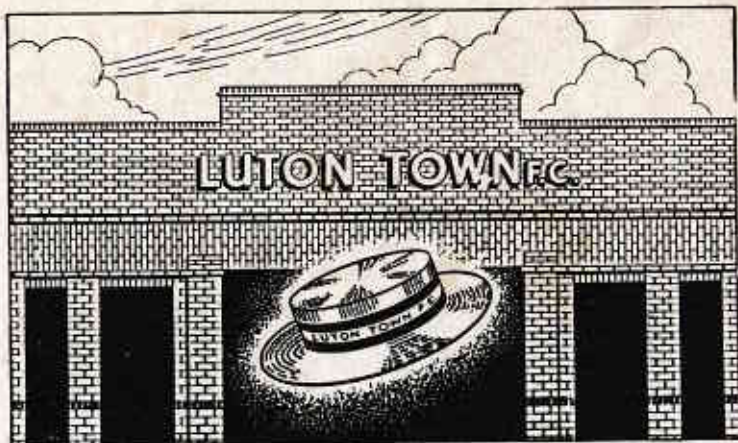

that it was the first-ever visit of Mansfield to Luton."

"If you look up your records of the 1931-32 season you will find that Luton played Mansfield on Good Friday at Luton when they won 3-1 and at Mansfield on Easter Monday when they lost 5-2.

"By the way, Mr. T. Hodgson, now Chairman of the Directors, was captain of Luton at the time."

Mr. Northwood, who has been a follower of Luton for 54 years says, "I hope they will soon improve, otherwise I shall have a job to follow them for another 54 years."

We would point out that this letter was written before last Saturday.

It was with regret that we learnt last week of the death of one of our former players the popular George Stephenson. Just prior to these notes going into print we have learned of the death of the Chairman of Shrewsbury Town Football Club, Mr. Joseph Jones. 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Club Notes

AFTER that stimulating result at Brentford last Saturday, we are naturally hoping that today will provide more points in our drive to avoid the indignity of further relegation.

Congratulations go to John O'Rourke who in only his eighth League match for us, scored four times to put up the best individual performance since Ron Davies hit the back of the net four times against Norwich City last season. Obviously, Ron Ashman, who was in direct opposition to Davies that day, remembered the lesson and the Welshman has been the hero of Carrow Road ever since he left us.

Definitely, he left a big gap but O'Rourke, at 19, has unlimited promise and now that he has really tasted "blood" in the shape of goals, may well be the means of spearheading our fight to avoid Division IV.

Ironically, perhaps, the first away win for over 15 months came when three Directors, plus the chief scout, were out looking for new players, and another Director was at Kenilworth Road having a look at Leicester Reserves, in whose team there are one or two players who might be secured for reasonable fees.

Basically, the Griffin Park triumph has not changed the general plan, though it has lessened the urgency, and second reports on two players were being made today.

On last Saturday's form which brought considerably more determination and fighting spirit than was the case the previous week, there can be high hopes that disaster will be staved off, but no

one on the staff is inclined to underestimate the difficulty of the situation.

There is a long row to hoe yet and it is going to take all the effort that can be produced to make a success of the fight because there is a most difficult programme to face.

However, the spirit seems to be right and, in the words of Gordon Turner who, in mid-week received his third benefit cheque, "This is a good club, otherwise I would not have stayed here for 15 years."

Out at the moment through back trouble, though he is back in light training, Turner's record for us is worth publishing because, in 401 League games he has scored 241 goals and that is a feat few footballers can claim to have equalled.

One who can and who has probably bettered it is Arthur Rowley, player-manager, of today's visitors, Shrewsbury Town.

In the course of a long first-class career, mainly with Fulham and Leicester City, Arthur gained a tremendous reputation as a marksman and his shooting helped Shrewsbury to take their place among the more successful teams in the Third Division.

Welcoming them to this ground, one can say definitely that this is the first time we have had the pleasure of their company and must hasten to retract what was written in this column when Mansfield Town were here a fortnight ago.

As a result, there came a letter from Mr. R. S. Northwood, of 55 Greenshields Road, Bedford, who says, "I read your programme and found to my amazement

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PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Paul Miller (goalkeeper). Born at Wolverhampton, he was an amateur with Walsall prior to signing as a professional for Shrewsbury in July 1959. Graduated with St. Nicholas Boys Club of Newport, Salop.

Pat Wright (full back). Joined the Club from Birmingham City in September 1962 and has proved a valuable acquisition. A strong tackler.

Ted Hemsley (full back). Native of Stoke-on-Trent this 19 year old has created a good impression with his consistent performances. Ted is also a Worcestershire cricketer and was formerly an amateur with Wolves and Highley Minors.

Albert Harley (wing half). Born in Chester and joined the Ground Staff from Lache F.C. in April 1956. Signed full time professional in May 1957. At 23 has already had one benefit. A non stop player.

Peter Dolby (centre half). Has now settled down into his original position after being tried at full back, wing half, and inside forward and was a big success last season. A strong player who commands the centre of the field.

Eric Brodie (wing half). Signed in the close season from Scottish First Division

Club Dundee United for a good sized fee. Was previously with Forfar Athletic. Was born at Blairgowrie, Perthshire.

John Gregson (outside right). Signed in April 1963 from Chester. Has had previous experience with Blackpool. In the first team games he played to the end of the season showed that he was more than a useful acquisition.

Robert Ross (inside forward). Was signed in the close season after previously being with Scottish First Division Club Hearts. Born in Edinburgh.

Frank Clarke (centre forward). A native of Wolverhampton this 21 year old signed professional in November 1961 after two and a half seasons as an amateur.

Harry Middleton (inside forward). Born in Birmingham he joined from Portsmouth in February 1962 and was formerly with Wolves and Scunthorpe United.

Arthur Rowley (inside forward). Player-Manager of the Club and a native of Wolverhampton he joined Shrewsbury in June 1958 from Leicester City after previously being with West Bromwich Albion and Fulham. Has broken all goalscoring records and is now 'out on his own.'
