Club Matters—continued

It is our pleasure to welcome to Boothferry Park this afternoon the Officials and Players of the Luton Town Football Club who will be making their first visit to us since season 1954/55. Founded in 1885 by an amalgamation of 'Luton Wanderers' with 'Luton Excelsior,' Luton were the first Club in the South of England to employ professional players. After operating for two seasons, 1894/95 and 1895/96 in the Southern League they became members of the League Division II in 1897 and remained in this League, until 1900 when they failed to gain re-election and returned to the Southern League. It was after the 1st World War when they again obtained League status by being admitted as members of the third Division in season 1920/21. The following year they were transferred to the Southern Section of League Division III and remained in this Division until promotion to the Second Division in 1937. Luton Town recommenced their football activities in season 1946/47 in the Second Division and eventually, in season 1954/55 the 'Hatters' were promoted to Division One. It was in season 1958/59 that Luton Town recorded one of the highlights of their Club's achievements by becoming F.A. Cup finalists and though beaten 2—1 by Nottingham Forest it will no doubt always remain one of the greatest moments in the history of Luton Town F.C.

Incidentally in the Luton Town team that day was our present player George Cummins. One season after appearing at Wembley Luton Town were relegated to a lower Division for the first time. At the end of last season further misfortune befell the Luton Club when they were relegated to Division Three. This season Luton Town have again been beset by the fears of relegation and at the time these notes are being written are third from the bottom of our Division. Recent performances however, suggest that Luton could still pull clear of the position that at present confronts them. In their last four away matches they have won two and drawn one, and two weeks ago gained two further valuable points, at our expense, when they defeated us at Kenilworth Road by two goals to one. As we have mentioned in other issues of our programme if visiting teams to Boothferry Park are influenced in any way by their previous results against us, be they favourable to them or not, then Luton Town could well come to us and fancy their chances of completing a double for on the six occasions they have met us at Boothferry Park they have been the victors four times, shared the points once and been defeated once. The last four of our home matches against Luton Town have finished in their favour by margins of 2—1, 2—0, 2—1 and 4—0. Whilst we realise Luton Town are anxious to gain every point they can we must hope we can record our first victory over the 'Hatters' since 1950/51.

PEN PICTURES OF LUTON TOWN F.C. PLAYERS

RON BAYNHAM (*Goalkeeper*). Has been with Luton Town since 1951. Was secured from Worcester City. He has represented England on several occasions. Played for the Football League on 2 occasions and also for England 'B' Team versus Yugoslavia 'B'. Was a member of the F.A. Touring team to South America in 1959.

ALAN McBAIN (*Right Fullback*). Born in Aberdeen. Played for Carlisle last season when he attracted the Luton Manager's attention. Transferred to Luton in exchange for J. Lornie and A. Ross. A very sound and capable defender.

JOHN BRAMWELL (*Left Fullback*). Joined Luton in October, 1960 from Everton and has proved a very capable player worthy to be considered for International honours. Played at wing-half on several occasions last season, proving equally successful.

DAVID PACEY (*Right Halfback*). Born in Luton, signed for the Club in 1956. Has played for the F.A. versus the R.A.F. and was also a member of the England under 23 team against Germany and Italy. Very strong player with a liking for getting among the goalscorers.

GRAHAM CALEB (*Centre Halfback*). This youngster signed as an Apprentice Footballer for Luton in December, 1961. Settled down very well and showed such promise that he was offered full Professional Registration in April, 1963.

MARK LOWNDS (*Left Halfback*). Signed from Durham in January, 1960. Became full-timer on completion of his apprenticeship with a local firm. Is a wing-half who likes to get on with the game. A tireless worker.

HARRY WALDEN (*Outside Right*). Joined Luton from Kettering in January, 1961, and stepped straight into the First Team. Severely injured at a crucial part of last season's programme which prevented him from taking any further part in the struggle against relegation. It is hoped he has lost none of his skill as a result of that injury.

THOMAS McKECHNIE (*Inside Right*). Born Glasgow, went to Luton direct from Rob Roy (Scotland) at the end of season 1960-61. Played consistently in the First Team the past two seasons, except when injury prevented him from playing.

RON DAVIES (*Centre Forward*). Obtained from Chester in October, 1962 and was an immediate success. Scored 21 goals, including 4 against Norwich City at Luton last April. His performances created much interest for the Wales under 23 Team.

GORDON TURNER (*Inside Left*). Went to Luton as a wing half upon his demob from the Navy but found his true position in the No. 8 shirt. Represented the English League against the Scottish League in 1955 and also played for the F.A. XI versus the Army in 1958. The Town's leading goalscorer for eight seasons, he is a skilled player with a tremendous shot.

FRED JARDINE (*Outside Left*). Born in Edinburgh. Played for Dundee for 2 seasons before going to Luton at the end of season 1960-61. Has shown promise since joining the Kenilworth Road Staff.

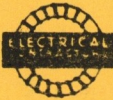

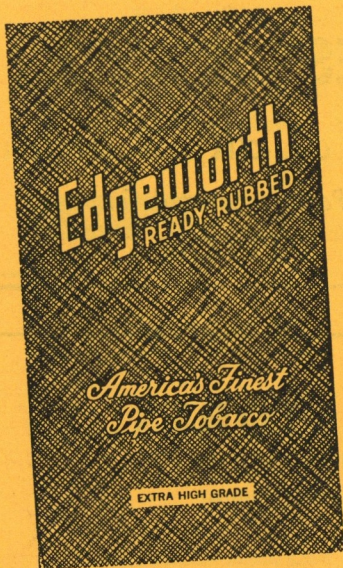
