Club Notes

FOR the next two weeks at least, the tension at Kenilworth Road as the team fights bravely to avoid the further disappointment of relegation, is likely to be unending.

Today, we meet our only opponents this season from Wales and have pleasure to welcome them for the first time to this ground but, without being inhospitable, for they have the reputation of being a friendly Club, we hope that they will return pointless.

If that is the case and we fervently hope that it will be, they can be regarded as condemned to another spell in the Fourth Division, whereas we shall renew our hopes of winning the battle against old friends of ours, Barnsley.

In fact, this is likely to be a decisive weekend in the battle to avoid relegation because Barnsley are at Crystal Palace today and meet Millwall at the Den on Monday.

For us, following today's match, we have the longish haul down to the West Country on Monday to meet Bristol Rovers in a match that has been postponed on two occasions.

Eastville has never been a lucky ground for us but we hope that the team will take confidence from the fact that they beat the Rovers with something to spare on Easter Saturday.

Following that, are two more away games, neither of which is likely to be easy, at Colchester next Saturday and Oldham on Wednesday week. Which sets the stage for what could be the biggest occasion at Kenilworth Road for some time when our near neighbours, Watford, are the visitors a fortnight today.

This really could prove to be a dramatic occasion, watched by the sort of crowd we have not seen on the ground for a long time and the demand for Centre Stand tickets from Watford supporters has been building up rapidly since the start of this week.

In ordinary times this "derby" game would be a crowd-puller, but with important issues probably involved for both Clubs, there will be more than usual interest.

Wrexham are an old established Club who hold the distinction of being the only members from North Wales in the Football League. Their potential is considerable and they have a ground, regularly used for International games, to match their ambitions.

However, despite a considerable outlay of money at one time or another, they have never got beyond the Third Division and, although before today's game, their position looked anything but promising, it can be taken for granted that they will not go out without a fight.

Unfortunately, we made a fruitless journey to Loftus Road last Saturday when the Queens Park Rangers pitch was flooded, but the postponement may well operate in our favour because the match has been re-arranged for Wednesday, 29th April, kick - off 7.30 p.m. and by then we shall have a very clear idea of what is needed from the team.

For the two new Directors, Mr. B. G. England and Mr. J. Richardson, this was a disappointing experience because they made their first trip with the team in an official capacity. However, there will be happier occasions and we wish both a long association with the Club.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Steve Fleet (goalkeeper). A close-season signing from Manchester City where he had been understudy to the great Bert Trautmann for many seasons. Wonderfully built for a 'keeper, Steve is expected to become one of the best last lines of defence the Racecourse club has had for many seasons.

Peter Jones (right back). An ex-Busby babe who was once considered to be one of Matt Busby's greatest junior signings. Peter appeared in the Old Trafford line-up immediately after the Munich disaster. Has attracted several Club scouts to the Raccourse ground with his stylish play.

David Powell (right half). Probably the brightest of several young stars at the Racecourse this season, David signed professional forms a week after making his debut at Bristol City at the end of last season, having been a groundstaff boy before then. Has captained the Welsh Youth team. Born at Dolgarrog, North Wales.

Terry Morrall (centre half). Another close-season signing. Terry was signed from Shrewsbury Town where he had been for three seasons. His only other League Club was Aston Villa, where he spent four seasons, making forty-odd first team appearances.

Eric Johnson (left half). Joined the paid ranks during the last close-scason after eighteen months on the ground staff. Was a regular member of the Cheshire League side last term, playing

many good games at wing half. Was spotted playing with Stork F.C. Born in Birkenhead.

Bill Myerscough (inside right). A well known name in the footballing world, Billy has been around quite a bit since first signing professional forms for Walsall and he arrived at the Racecourse via Aston Villa, Rotherham United, Coventry City and Chester. Billy is a brilliant ball player and hard to get off the ball.

Ernie Phythian (centre forward). Came to the Club as part of the deal that took Wyn Davies to Bolton Wanderers in February 1962. Ernie had plenty of First Division experience at Burnden Park. A cricketer of no mean ability, having played several times for Lancashire 2nd XI.

Arfon Griffiths (inside forward). Started with the Club as an amateur, signing professional in 1959 and in February 1961 joined Arsenal for a £15,000 fee. Whilst with the "Gunners" he made many first team appearances as well as gaining an Under-23 cap, but he returned to his former Club in September last eason for a Club record five figure fee. A small player but on his day probably ranks as one of the cleverest in the game.

Clive Colbridge (outside left). Has seen service with Leeds United, York City, Workington, Crewe Alexandra and Manchester City, arriving at Wrexham from Maine Road in February 1962 for a very large fee. Born Hull.
