

MORRIS GAMBLE COMES OFF

Wrexham 2, Luton Town 0

This clear-cut victory must have been some encouragement to Wrexham manager Billy Morris, who took the risk of including four teenagers into the team including 18-year-old David Harding a Liverpool amateur.

The score hardly did justice to Wrexham's superiority. They were in command of the game from first to last. Sammy McMillan put them in front after 13 minutes and he added a second goal after 75 minutes.

There were occasions when Luton were never in the game. Both Barry Fry and Tom McKechnie did show early promise on the right wing, but it never materialised. Both found young Alec Lucas a formidable obstacle.

Luton were inclined to panic when Wrexham hotted up the attack. Freddie Jardine could never cope with the speed of Keith Webber on the right wing.

There were a few occasions when goalkeeper Tinsley saved the situation with some brilliant saves, but he was definitely at fault with McMillan's second goal. He caught the ball, which had been lobbed at the goalmouth, but let it slip out of his hands to present McMillan with a gift.
