

O'ROURKE FAILS 'SHOP WINDOW' TEST

R E P R E S E N T A T I V E S from eight clubs saw Luton puff and pant their way to two Fourth Division points last night.

But if eyes were on John O'Rourke, transfer-seeking centre forward, then interested clubs will want to look again.

O'Rourke, usually good for goals, ran hard and distributed cleverly—but failed with a good chance in each half.

It was left to Ray Whittaker, one-time England youth star, to score the goal that gave Luton their third home win of the season.

In the 14th minute left winger Whittaker snapped up a long pass from John Reid and rushed the ball first-time past Steve Fleet.

These are certainly

changed times for Luton—once First Division artists, now artisans deep down in the Fourth Division.

But the effort and endeavour were there. And in 19-year-old centre half Alan Rivers they have a fine prospect.

But Luton made hard work of beating a Wrexham side that had only the clever touches of Arfon Griffiths to offer up front.
