

IT'S A £20,000 SHOW BY O'ROURKE!

J O H N O'ROURKE,
Luton's transfer-
seeking centre forward,
slammed a great hat-
trick last night—
watched by seven
League managers.

Among them were Bill
McGarry, of Ipswich,
Northampton's Dave
Bowen, and Dave Sexton,
of Leyton Orient.

the ground knowing that
nothing less than a £20,000
cheque will persuade the
Fourth Division club to
part with their star.

O'Rourke played with
skill and fire, showing all
the ability that made him
one of the most talked-
about centre forwards in

the South a couple of years
ago.

It was a night of glory,
too, for another goal ace—
Doncaster's Alec Jeffrey,
the one-time wonder boy
who was written off after
twice breaking a leg.

He hit two goals in a
game that see-sawed dram-
atically

Doncaster scored first
after twelve minutes when
Colin Grainger sent over a
centre for Jeffrey to score.

Equalised

O'Rourke equalised in the
twentieth minute and
seconds later Luton went
ahead through Ray Whit-
taker.

Doncaster's second came
in the twenty-fourth min-
ute when a slip by Luton
centre half Alan Rivers let
Trevor Ogden in.

Whittaker blazed wide
for Luton early in the
second half, but in the fifty-
fourth minute O'Rourke
put them ahead with a
shot that caught goal-
keeper Fred Potter off
guard.

Twenty minutes later,
O'Rourke headed his team's
fourth—and Doncaster
looked a well-beaten side.

But with nine minutes to
go Jeffrey snapped their
third.
