NEXT best thing to winning an F.A. Cup-tie is to stage a home replay which we are doing tonight with Romford our first non-League visitors in the F.A. Cup since Scarborough came here for a third round replay in January, 1938, after we had had a scare on their ground.

As we saw on Saturday, Romford have progressive ideas which they have translated into their ground facilities. The hospitable way in which we were made welcome left nothing to be desired and we hope to reciprocate in similar vein this evening.

There, of course, we trust that the generosity will stop because after the hard won draw at the Brooklands Stadium, we look confidently to the players to win through to the second round in which, if we are successful tonight, we are due to visit another Southern League team, Corby Town, in what could almost be classed as a local derby.

At the moment, we are not quite clear what is the exact holding capacity of the Corby ground, but we do know that our quota of stand tickets will be no more than 150.

Corby officials are accompanying their players here tonight and, afterwards, there will be a discussion with the winners on prices and, probably, on how

far the issue of tickets beforehand should go.

Naturally, we are disappointed at not having the luck to stage a Cup-tie ourselves but, providing there is no slip up tonight, then we feel we have a bright chance of joining the bigger clubs in the draw for the third round.

Before the second round, there is not much breathing space because it is due to be played a fortnight on Saturday.

Meanwhile, there is the necessity to look to the League programme and the search for precious points to drive on our undoubted chance of promotion.

There is an attractive match on Saturday when Notts County, who are immediately above us in the League table by virtually an infinitesimal superiority in goal average.

The County are old Second and Third Division friends and rivals of ours who, like ourselves, have hopes that better things are in store for them in the immediate future.

Unfortunately for them, their Cup career this season was short-lived because they made their exit at Southend, but probably this will make them all the more keen to make certain that they finish in the top four in Division IV.

In point of fact, our boys face a hectic period because, after these two matches, they have only two days respite before

Stan Earl (goalkeeper). Has just returned to this country from Australia and was signed just in time to qualify for this Round. Was formerly with West Ham.
