Our Visitors . .

A former Luton Town player holds the record for the highest number of goals in one season in the history of the old Southern Section of the Third Division. This was centre-forward Joe Payne, who scored 55 goals out of his club's total of 103 in 1936-37.

Payne also holds the all-time record for the highest individual total in one game, when he scored ten in a 12—0 victory over Bristol Rovers 30 years ago—on April 13th, 1936.

When they reached Wembley in 1959 the Hatters were without a manager for most of the season, Mr. Dally Duncan having been released to take over at Blackburn in October that winter. His successor as manager was Syd Owen, who played at centre-half in the 1959 Final, and was elected Footballer of the Year shortly before his appearance at Wembley, taking over as manager immediately afterwards. He left Kenilworth Road in April, 1960.

Luton were concerned in one of the most closely-fought post-war promotion struggles in the Second Division in 1954-55. Birmingham City, Luton and Rotherham United all finished with 54 points that season, with the Midlanders taking the title and the Hatters finishing second on goal average.

One of the most versatile members of the present Luton playing staff is Gordon Riddick. He made his debut at inside-left in December, 1962, and has subsequently occupied the other four forward positions as well as playing at right-half and right-back.

Prior to reaching the Cup Final in 1959, the Hatters had never progressed beyond the sixth round, and had only twice reached that stage. The first occasion they did this was in 1933 and the other in 1952. In 1933 their sixth round opponents were Everton, who defeated them 6—0 at Goodison Park and then went on to win the Cup.

A former Luton player who ranked among the most consistent goalscorers in the country during his career was Gordon Turner. Signed as a professional in 1950, he was the Hatters' leading scorer in no fewer than seven seasons, five of them in succession, and on another four occasions finished as their second highest marksman. At the time of his departure from Kenilworth Road at the end of the 1963-64 season Turner had scored 243 goals in 406 League appearances.
