### Club Notes

WITHOUT any doubt at all, the most critical stage of what has been a long, but intensely interesting season, is now upon us and the visit of Stockport County today is the first of six League games facing us in the space of 19 days.

Fortunately, for the moment, our recent bad run with injuries seems to be over because we are expecting to be back at full strength today and can only hope that there will be no more weakening of our playing resources in the weeks that lie immediately ahead.

At this stage, it is impossible to set a target that will assure us of Third Division football next season, but it is perfectly obvious that there must be no slip-up in the three home matches that are left and that some measure of reward must be gained from the three on opponents' ground.

First of these comes next Wednesday evening when we visit Chester, who are still in the promotion running and the result of this match will have far-reaching consequences on the final line-up in the table.

This will be the club's first visit to Chester's compact Sealand Road ground and the only previous link between the clubs, apart from their visit here in January when we gained a resounding 5-2 victory, was our buying of Ron Davies from them some three years ago, a deal that turned out very well from the Luton point of view.

Next Saturday, sees something of a departure in that we are breaking with tradition and staging a League match on Cup Final Day, but with a 7.30 p.m. kick-off against Port Vale who asked for the fixture to be brought forward so that they can clear the way for a foreign tour.

After that, comes the postponed visit to Halifax on the Monday and the end of the programme at Kenilworth Road on Thursday week when Barrow will be here for the return. Even then, though, there is still one match to play—that at Newport on Wednesday, May 25th, which is one that could assume vastly important proportions.

A home match for our youth team in the South East Counties' League against Crystal Palace has been fixed for Monday week and we will endeavour to keep those attending up to date with the score from Halifax.

One of the linesmen today, Mr. Morris, of Kettering, will be in a vastly different setting next Saturday because he has been honoured by being chosen to run a line at Wembley in the Cup Final. Mr. Morris has made several previous appearances on this ground, not only as a linesman in the League, but as a referee in the Football Combination.

If the people, signing themselves "Dedicated supporters" but giving no names or addresses will contact us further, we may then be able to go deeper into the matter of their suggested theme song for the club.

## PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

### HISTORY OF STOCKPORT COUNTY

The club was founded in 1883, but did not play at Edgely Park as Stockport County until 1900, when they played in the Lancashire League. In 1922 County were champions of the newly formed Third Division, and on gaining promotion, remained in the Second Division until 1926.

They have held one record since 1934, when the team beat Halifax Town by 13 goals to nil. This record remains unbroken.

**J. Collins** (right back). Born in Manchester. Started his football career with Blackburn Rovers before joining our Club in February 1964. John played regularly in the first team last season, and is a promising player.

**M. Tillotson** (left back). Maurice was formerly with Huddersfield Town, and on his return from a vacation in Canada decided to join the County. Was born in Keighley.

**C. Parry** (wing half). A local boy who signed for the Club in 1962, and held his place in the first team all last season.

**L. White** (centre forward). Born in Rotherham, Len is a very experienced player, having been with Newcastle Utd. and later Huddersfield Town. A accomplished forward.

**R. Young** (inside forward). Another of the closed season's signings. A skilful

forward who has regularly appeared in the Grimsby Town first team, the Club he came from.

**J. Price** (winger). John has been with Burnley as a winger, and has appeared with the first team on a number of occasions. Very fast and tricky.

**M. Eckersall**. Another of the part timers who has seen service with the first team. A wing half of considerable promise.

**E. Cuthbert**. Born in Kilmarnock, Ean is in his third season with the County, having joined us from Blackpool. A very strong defender.

**G. Beighton**. Has been with the Club for some five seasons and had a regular berth in the First Team. Graham was born in Sheffield.

**T. Roberts**. County signed Tom just before the deadline last season and first appeared at Southport. He played in every game for the remainder of the season.
