

Club Notes

IF there has been a bigger disappointment in a single vital match in the recent history of our Club, then it is difficult to imagine anything more frustrating than the occurrence at Chester on Wednesday.

In a brilliant first half display in torrential rain, our boys built up what would have assuredly been a winning lead of two goals and, then, with the pitch having become a near lake, due to the tropical nature of the downpour, the referee found it necessary to abandon the match with only two minutes of the second half gone.

Let us hasten to say that we do not criticise the official who allowed 10 minutes grace in order to give the ground staff a chance to disperse sufficient of the surface water to allow the match to proceed, but it proved an impossible task.

In the circumstances, the referee had no option but to call a halt, to the intense disappointment of our players who had worked so hard to build the winning lead that looked certain to bring us the two points we needed to thrust home our challenge for promotion.

From the Chester officials, disappointed as they are at having dropped out of the promotion race themselves, we received nothing but sympathy and helpful assistance when it came to discussing an alternative date

Obviously, with a match at Halifax on Monday and one at home with Barrow next Thursday, next week was out to all intents and purposes.

Then, on Wednesday week, there is the visit to Newport which left a fortnight today, the last day of the season as the only reasonable date

Even though Chester had hoped to have completed their home programme some time before then so that they could proceed with the work on their pitch which, by the way, was in remarkably good condition, otherwise Wednesday's match would not have lasted so long as it did, they readily agreed.

So, Saturday, May 28th, kick-off 3 p.m. at Sealand Road it is and it could well be a fateful day, because that is when Colchester with whom we may prove finally to be disputing fourth place in the table, complete their fixtures with a visit to Newport who through circumstances beyond their control, have a big say in the final reckoning, without entering into it themselves.

Tonight, we bid a warm welcome to Port Vale under their general manager, Sir Stanley Matthews, perhaps the most famous player of the past decade and can only hope that nothing will go amiss to upset the climax for which we are building up in our tremendous effort to bring a higher grade of football back to Kenilworth Road.

Do not forget that our Youth Team will be in action on this ground against Crystal Palace in a South East Counties League match on Monday evening, kickoff 7.30, and that fans will be kept informed of the progress of the first team's game at Halifax.
