Club Chatter . . .

Another season is almost over. Luton Town's appearance here tonight provides the end of the 1965-66 campaign, and the question uppermost in all our minds is whether this is the end of league soccer at the Shay. The board wish only that they could give a definite answer before the curtain comes down with this important game against one of the sides driving for promotion to Division Three.

Unfortunately, and through no fault of the club, it is not yet possible to do so. Today, the appeal launched for £25,000 by the Mayor of Halifax, Coun. H. Ludlam, J.P., closes, its results have been less satisfactory than

we had expected.

But other fund raising avenues are being explored remorselessly and methodically. In several instances we have had disappointments, acute ones, yet the directors are determined that, if at all possible, Division Four

football should be continued here next August.

Exactly how that ambition might be fulfilled we do not know. The situation is complex. It demands courage, commonsense and care in good measure We hope that the decision which the board will take quite soon will be the one for which you, our supporters, are so earnestly hoping, and that, if it is, the public generally will respond more readily to our appeals for support in the future.

Meanwhile the club wish to thank everyone connected with their affairs for the efforts made, particularly since news of the cash crisis broke so dramatically in the local press on Tuesday, February 22nd, a fateful day in

the eventful annals of Halifax Town Football Club.

The players and the behind the scenes staff have responded magnificently to the call, and taken one important worry away from the board, that of whether a second successive re-election application would be necessary. The fact that they have done so well is an additional encouragement to the directors at this critical time.

You our loyal followers - a few of you with memories of Sandhall and Exley days before and immediately after the first world war, have demonstrated a faith and allegiance to the club, which is an inspiration,

too.

Finally we thank the advertisers in this programme, and the club's well-wishers in general who have underlined their concern about the situation by sending donations, often anonymously, or promising cash guarantees if town go on-

Rest assured the board, upon whose actions so much depends, do not want to fail you. As well as anyone else versed in soccer policies and politics they know that, once Football League status has been surrendered,

the odds against its being regained are astronomical.

Our Visitors

At a time when so many folk are recalling Town's history the name of Luton Town crops up frequently. When they visited us last in 1932-33 it was for an F. A. Cup fifth-round tie

The game attracted a then record crowd of 29,235 and produced record receipts at the time of over £1,600. Town lost the match by 2-0 after play

had been interrupted by a snowstorm.

More recently, last month, Luton arrived for the original fixture, but it was postponed because of snow. Tonight their aim is to clinch promotion 12 months after being relegated, and to begin the return journey to Division

One, of which they were members only six years ago.

One of their best known players is John O'Rourke, the former Chelsea centre forward, a scorer when town lost by 4-1 at Kenilworth Road last November. Another notability is John Reid. ex-Bradford City inside forward, who has also been with Northampton Town. His current position is wing half.

PEN PICTURES

- RIDDICK, Gordon (Right Back) After a short period of apprenticeship, turned professional in 1961. Much is expected of this lad as he gains experience.
- JARDINE, Freddy (Left Back) Born in Edinburgh, and played for Dundee for two seasons before coming to Luton in 1961. Originally an outside left, he was successfully converted to a full-back.
- GIBSON, Jimmy (Right Half) Born Belfast, and his first English club was Newcastle United. Came to Luton in 1965, and was a regular member of the first team for the remainder of the season.
- MOORE, John (Left Half) Signed from Motherwell in May, 1965. He was recommended to us, and a bright future is forecast for him.
- WOODS, Matt (Centre Half) A Lancashire man, his first club was Blackburn Rovers, for whom he played 126 times, including the Cup Final, before going to Australia in 1963. Came to Luton on his return.
- EDWARDS, Richard (Inside Right) Came to Luton as an amateur in 1963, and was offered professional terms in 1964.
- O'ROURKE, John (Centre Forward) Previous clubs Arsenal and Chelsea, from whom Luton signed him. Scored 22 goals in 23 appearances, but last season he was dogged by injuries.
- REID, John (Inside Left) Was previously with Bradford and Northampton, from whom Luton signed him in 1963 at a substantial fee. A tireless and energetic worker, he has settled down well at Luton.
- WHITTAKER, Ray (Outside Left) A Londoner from Bow, his only other club was Arsenal. Gained England Youth honours in 1962—3 (with John O'Rourke), and joined Luton in 1964. Has been a first team regular ever since.


