Club Notes

TONIGHT sees the closure so far as Kenilworth Road is concerned of a most interesting season and one that has certainly exceeded the expectations of most people when it became plain that we should be having our first sample of football in the Fourth Division.

In the event, the fight for promotion has turned out to be the most absorbing of all and is still far from settled.

Naturally, we still have our hopes that we shall be among the four moving up a step at the end of this season, but there is a long row to hoe yet and the first obstacle to our progress comes this evening when we welcome Barrow for the first time.

Just over a fortnight ago, with a much weakened team, we went to Holker Street and recorded a 1-0 victory. Completion of the double tonight will leave us with the task of gaining probably three points from our two remaining away matches with Newport County and Chester to bring to a successful conclusion, the fight the team has fought so courageously in the face of handicaps in the shape of injuries to key players.

Unfortunately, we looked like being without others, following the lapse at Halifax on Monday and can only trust that those brought in as replacements, will fill the bill and so set the stage for a thrilling climax.

For one reason or another, our season has settled a month longer than is usually the case which makes it all the more imperative that we should press on without delay with arrangements for the new season which, presumably will begin on August 20th if recent precedents are followed.

Already, possibly in anticipation of the promotion we all desire so much, we have had a number of applications for season tickets which can be booked now. Present season ticket holders will be given until July 23rd to exercise their option on retaining their present seats, after which date, those not taken up, will be offered to those who are not ticket holders at the moment.

Perhaps, this is a suitable moment to emphasise that there will probably be more football on this ground next season because with the Reserves competing in the new mid-week competition, the likelihood is that home South East Counties Leagues games in which the Youth XI take part will be staged here on Saturdays.

Finally, we cannot allow this occasion to pass without expressing our heart-felt thanks to all who have helped the Club in so many varying ways this season. Particularly have we in mind, the Stewards, the Gatemen, those who have assisted with the licensed and tea bars, the ball boys and, in fact, everybody who has been of assistance during a time that has not been easy.

MILLARD, LANCE (Goalkeeper)

Now in his second season having played in 16 League matches last season. Formerly with Aldershot, Born Bristol.

CARBERRY, LARRY (full back)

A new signing from Ipswich Town for whom he played regularly in their championship season. A native of Liverpool.
