In my view the Town were worthy of a point, and they came close to getting one in the second half when Whit-taker hit the bar with a free kick from the edge of the penalty area after distracting the attention of the defensive wall by sending Riddick towards the far post as a decoy.

Bad passing hampered the Town, particularly in the first half, but Pleat came close to giving them the lead when a pass by Rioch split the defence and the winger was unfortunate when his shot
