## PUT GIFT GOAL THE TOWN OUT

## Had all the play in first half

Luton Town 1, Aldershot 2

LUTON TOWN made their exit from the League Cup in the first round replay at Kenilworth Road on Monday night, after a gift equaliser in the second half had revitalised Aldershot, and upset the confidence of the home defence.

However, the Town, who led by a 40th-minute goal from Gerry King, had enough chances in the first half, when they were well on top, to have won the

game comfortably.

The turning point of the match came in the 56th minute, just after King had left the field to have an ankle injury attended to.

Aldershot, who had been doing more attacking in the second half, made a raid upfield. Riddick intercepted the ball and elected to make a back-pass. This was a tragic blunder as it turned out, because the ball did not carry, and with no Luton players near him, Howfield picked up the loose ball, made ground and shot against a post.

RAFFERTY who hammered it home for a goal from which the Town never recovered. Although King returned

hobbling, Luton at this time had lost the initiative, and Aldershot snatched a 75tnminute winner through a header by HOWARTH from a lobbed-through ball by Renwick. This was an unfortunate set

of circumstances for the Town after the way in which they had dictated play earlier on. In torrential rain, which was so heavy that it obscured the lines on one side of the field, so that the second half had to be held up for seven minutes while they were re-sanded, Luton had adopted the right tactics - shooting first time from any range, but sheer oad luck and some confident goa!keeping by Godfrey robbed them of a commanding lead. RIOCH A POWER IN ATTACK

## Rioch had been a power n the Luton attack in the early

stages with some defencesplitting through-passes and some strong, first-time shooting. Early on Godfrey was drawn

right out of his goal in kicking away a through-ball by Rioch as Pleat raced in. Thomson was also doing a great deal to bolster up the attack, and there was panick in the Aldershot defence on

one occasion when he came up the field to make a cross which Pleat just failed to reach with his head. The bail was returned across the goal where Walker scrambled away. Thomson and Pleat were combining well, and from a through-pass by the former, Godfrey just managed to take

as Luton's relentless pressure continued.

King had two shots narrowly wide of the mark before he eventually put the Town in front in the 40th minute with a good header down into the net from a

corner by Whittaker. Almost on the interval the

Town came close to increasing their lead when following a free-kick, Rioch moved 'ip to hit a screaming drive which Godfrey just managed to save full-length at the expense of a corner. None of the 4,832 crowd

that braved the cloudburst, could have doubted that the Town would not consolidate their position in the second half.

However there came a transformation by Aldershot, with Maloy in the main-spring of their attack. Maloy brought Read into action early on with a good shot, and then Rafferty had the ball in the net from a pass by Howfield but was given off-side. Luton were reduced to 10

men when King went down awkwardly, twisting an ankle in face of a challenge by Renwick, and was carried off the field to have attention behind the goal. It was while he was off that

the Town's fateful lapse in defence let in Howfield for Rafferty to grab the equaliser. Read drew applause for

turning a great drive by McAnearney over the top of the bar, but the Luton defence was generally none too certain and the ball was in the net again, this time from Howarth who was pulled up for offside. Pleat was fouled on the edge of the area as he

breaking through from a Whittaker pass, and a chance to right matters fell to the Town with a free kick. However Whittaker's luck was out on this occasion and although
