VISITING TEAM - Details

TERRENCE ADAMSON (Full-back). Born at Shiney Row, Co. Durham. Transferred to Luton from Sunderland in July, 1966. Only 18 years of age. He appeared last season for Sunderland in the Final of the F.A. Youth Cup Final. GRAHAM FRENCH (Winger). Born at Wolverhampton. Graham came into prominence when playing for Shrewsbury and whilst with them he gained Youth International caps for England. Later he played for Swindon and Watford, before joining Luton in October, 1965. Can play on either wing.

ERIC GRIEVE (Half-back). His birth place is the Scottish town of Gatehouse-of-Fleet. Was last season playing for Tarff Rovers, Kirkcowan as an Amateur and was persuaded to try the Professional game in July, 1966.

FREDDIE JARDINE (Full-back). Although born in Edinburgh, he played for 2 seasons for Dundee before coming South to Luton in 1961. Was signed as an Outside Left but has since made the Left Back position his own.

BRIAN JOHNSON (Winger). Born at Newcastle. His only other Club was Sunderland from whom he scored his transfer in July, 1966. He also appeared in the F.A. Youth Cup Final in the same team as Terrence Adamson.

GERALD KING (Winger). A Welshman by birth, he played for his Country both as a Schoolboy and at Youth International Level. Has played for Cardiff and Torquay, from whom he was transferred in June, 1966.

JOHN MOORE (Wing-half). In his second season for Luton. Previously played for Motherwell. Made 43 League appearances and scored 5 goals last season which can be said to be a satisfactory baptism into English football. PETER MOONEY (Winger). Is an Apprentice on our Staff whose appearances last season were mainly confined to Youth football, but on the occasions when he was called upon for Reserve Team duties he performed well, and it is hoped that he will develop into another success. Born in Luton.

JOHN NICHOLSON (Centre-half). Another product of our Youth scheme. Born at Bristol. Was signed as a part-time player in December 1965 and came on to our full time staff in June 1966. He made a number of Reserve Team appearances last season and shows much promise.

DAVID PLEAT (Winger). Born at Nottingham. He played for England Youth Team and also Nottingham Forest, from whom we secured his transfer in August, 1964. Was a regular member of our First Team until he had the great misfortune to break a leg. Now recovered, he is determined to make his presence felt once more.

TONY READ (Goalkeeper). Born at Haydock, his first Club was Sheffield Wednesday, and in 1964 he left them to go to Peterborough. Was then transferred from there to Luton in March 1965; to show his versatility, he last season made 35 appearances in the forward line scoring 12 goals besides 6 appearances in goal.

GORDON RIDDICK (Inside-forward). Turned Professional in April 1961 following a short period of Apprenticeship. He has been with this Club since this date making many first team appearances equally well at Full-back, Halfback and as a Forward. He was born at Langlebury.

BRUCE RIOCH (Inside-forward). Although born at Aldershot he was brought up in Luton and represented the town at School, also having trials for the England School-Boys Team. He signed Apprentice Professional in August, 1963 and full Professional in September, 1964. Made 21 League appearances last season.

ALAN RIVERS (Half-back). Born at Portsmouth, he signed Professional forms for this Club in January 1964, after playing 3 years for us as an Amateur. He is a very well built lad who can also play with success at Centre-forward. ALAN SLOUGH (Full-back). Another Luton boy who has graduated through the ranks of Schoolboy, Amateur and Apprentice Professional, being offered Full Terms in May, 1965. He is another boy on whom the Club will pin its faith for the future. Can also play with distinction at Wing-half and Insideforward, in fact he gained County Representative honours as an Amateur in the latter position.

TONY THEAR (Centre-forward). He was born at Tottenham and joined their neighbours Arsenal as Apprentice Professional. He can also play at Centre-half and whilst at Highbury his appearances were divided between these 2 positions. He holds an F.A. Youth Cup winners medal.
