LUTON TOWN KNOW WHAT IT IS TO STRUGGLE

The Easter programme of the City club is vitally important to us, as the three games represent probably our last hope of escaping from the bottom four of the Fourth Division. This is particularly so in view of the fact that two of our fixtures are against Lincoln City, who are also engaged in the struggle.

Lincoln have been pulling away nicely, however, whereas we have not been able to gather in points except from odd drawn games, and a gap has been created

between us and the next club.

However, the struggle must not be given up and we must fight to the end of this most depressing season. Despite all the travelling by so many representatives of the club, we were unable to make a signing before the deadline date on March 16th. The inability of the club to secure new players has been a most frustrating experience for all concerned.

The position generally is causing great anxiety to the management with the lack of playing success and the alarming drop in attendances, the level of which is more in keeping with reserve football than League soccer, and clearly no club

could continue on that level of support.

This is Luton Town's first ever visit to Bootham Crescent: in fact, it is our first game with them, as when we went to Luton recently, the ground was unfit and the fixture postponed. Luton know what it is to fall on bad times. Ex-First Division members up to 1960, they were also defeated F.A. Cup finalists in 1959, so we can appreciate that to drop into the Fourth Division is a bitter pill.

Yes, other clubs have their trials besides our own. Once in a lowly plight, it is not easy to get out of it despite what so many critics seem to think, but we will

go on striving to regain lost prestige.

Our game with Lincoln City on Monday is at 7.15 p.m.

Congratulations to Bootham United, our Sunday League team, who, under the generalship of Ron Spence, have won their division and gained promotion. There are some promising young players in this side.

LUTON TOWN PEN PICTURES

- READ, Tony (centre-forward). His first club was Sheffield Wednesday, and in 1964 he left to go to Peterborough. Was then transferred to Luton in March, 1965.
- ADAMSON, Terrence (full-back). Transferred to Luton from Sunderland in July, 1966. He appeared last season for Sunderland in the final of the F.A. Youth Cup.
- **SLOUGH, Alan** (full-back). Another Luton boy who has graduated through the ranks of schoolboy, amateur and apprentice professional, being offered full terms in May, 1965.
- THOMSON, Bobby (full-back). He first came into prominence with Partick Thistle, and was later transferred to Liverpool for a big fee.
- RIVERS, Alan (centre-half). Signed professional forms for Portsmouth in January, 1964, after playing three years for Luton as an amateur.
- JARDINE, Freddie (full-back). Played for two seasons for Dundee before going to Luton in 1961.
- **GRIEVE, Eric** (half-back). Was last season playing for Tarff Rovers, Kirkcowan, as an amateur and was persuaded to try the professional game in July, 1966.
- NICHOLSON, John (centre-half). Another product of the Youth scheme. Was signed as a part-time player in December, 1965.
- MOORE, John (wing-half). In his second season for Luton. Previously played for Motherwell.
- JOHNSON, Brian (winger). His only other club was Sunderland. He appeared in the F.A. Youth Cup final in the same team as Terrence Adamson.
- KING, Gerald (winger). A Welshman, he played for his country both as a schoolboy and at Youth international level. Has played for Cardiff and Torquay.
- PLEAT, David (winger). Played for England Youth team and also for Nottingham Forest.
- RIDDICK, Gordon (inside-forward). Turned professional in April, 1961, following a short period of apprenticeship.
- RIOCH, Bruce (inside-forward). Was brought up in Luton and represented the town at school, also having trials for the England school team.
- THEAR, Tony (centre-forward). Joined Arsenal as apprentice professional. Can also play at centre-half. He holds an F.A. Youth Cup winners' medal.
- FRENCH, Graham (winger). Came intro prominence when playing for Shrewsbury and gained Youth international caps for England. Later he played for Swindon and Watford.
- MOONEY, Peter (winger). Is an apprentice whose appearances last season were mainly confined to Youth football.
- WHITTAKER, Reg. (outside-left). A Londoner, his only other club being Arsenal. He gained England Youth international caps in 1962 and 1963.


