OUR visitors tonight, Southend United, are paying their first visit to Kenilworth Road since November, 1964, when we met them here twice in a fortnight.

First encounter was in an F.A. Cup-tie which we won 1-0 and, a fortnight later. Southend reversed the score in a League match.

Tonight, both teams urgently need points for vastly differing reasons. Fact that our team have collected only one point from the last ten at stake has served to revive the fear that we might finally be concerned in the re-electron issue, a bogey that we seemed to have laid a few short weeks back.

Since then, injuries have been a considerable handicap to Manager Allan Brown and although the position has improved slightly, we have not been at full strength for some considerable time.

On the other hand, Southend are very much in the fight for promotion to regain the Third Division place they lost at the end of last season.

From this match, and from the return at Southend on Monday week, they will be looking for vital points, but our team's home record has been such this season, that we have high hopes of two points this evening.

Then, on Saturday, comes another tough task against another promotion-chasing team, Barrow, who have the best away record in the Fourth Division, and who gained the full quots of points over

the Easter holiday to press home their claims

Earlier in the season, we went down 3-0 on their Holker Street ground, but last season, when Barrow paid their first - ever visit to this ground, the result was an exciting 3-2 victory for us.

A similar result on Saturday would be very pleasing and we are hoping for a bigger than average crowd to see this successful combination.

Unfortunately, our young wing-half, Alan Slough, will not be taking part in any of the remaining matches this season.

He is due to go into hospital for a cartilage operation and his sights now must be fixed on a return to complete fitness for the start of next season.

The ball for tonight's match has been donated by Mr. H. Goldman, licensee of the Star Inn, Chalton, who is interested in both teams in that he was formerly at the Peter Boat Inn, Leigh-on-sea.

Other offers of footballs from local firms or individuals will be warmly welcomed.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Trevor Roberts (goalkeeper). Born in Caernarvon, North Wales and has a number of Welsh Amateur Caps to his credit. Joined Liverpool and played in the reserve side for two years before being transferred to Southend United in January, 1966. Holds a Liverpool University Degree in Geography.

Tony Bentley (full back). Born Trent Vale. Joined Southend from Stoke City as a right winger in 1961, later reverted to half back and has now again successfully changed into full back.

Graham Birks (full back). Signed from Peterborough United in January, 1966. Was previously with Sheffield Wednesday. Born Sheffield.

Mel Slack (wing half). Born Bishop Auckland. Signed from Sunderland, his only previous professional club in August 1965. Fine attacking wing half, has also played inside forward

Eddie May (centre half). Born Epping, Essex, Previously played as an amateur with Dagenham Football Chib until he signed as a professional for Southend United in January, 1965. Stepped into the centre half spot last season and has shown a tremendous amount of improvement in this position.

Tony Beanland (wing half). Signed from Southport in March, 1966, previously with Blackpool. Strong attacking wing half with excellent distribution. Born Bradford.

Derek Woodley (winger). Born Isleworth Middlesex. Previous club West Ham United. Signed for Southend United in August 1963. One of the fastest wingers in the Third and Fourth Divisions, and has a particularly powerful shot.

Ray Smith (inside right). Born Islington, London. Joined Southend as an amateur and signed professional forms in December 1961. Powerfully built inside forward with tremendous stamina and strong shot. Second highest scorer last season.

Eddie Firmani (centre forward), Born South Africa, Played for Charlton before being transferred to Italy where he played for Sampodoria Inter-Milan and Genoa before returning to Charlton for two seasons. Was signed for Southend in May 1965. Very talented player who was United's top scorer last season, playing 36 League games.

Andy Smillie (inside forward). Born Minster. Previous professional clubs West Ham United, Crystal Palace and Scunthorpe United, from whom he was signed in May, 1965. Has played inside forward, left wing and left half.

John McKinven (winger), Signed on a free transfer from Raith Rovers in 1960, Ball playing winger who has always retained a First Team spot during his service with Southend United, Born Campbelltown, Scotland.
