Club Notes

MUCH of the depression that had been brought about by our team's failure to win any of the previous five matches was lifted on Wednesday evening when, deservedly, Southend United were beaten by the only goal and the margin could well have been more.

In fact, the team's display was really a continuation of the improvement that could be detected even in defeat at Crewe last Saturday.

As a result, with the team showing much determination and a sense of urgency that was so necessary in view of the sore need for points, Southend, who came with such high hopes of giving their promotion bid a boost, must have been shaken by the way in which they were forced back on the defensive from the start.

Unfortunately, not so many supporters as we would have liked, were here to see the triumph because the turnstiles clicked only to the extent of 4,666, our lowest gate since the end of October.

However, the weather, cold and wet, was not at all inviting and must have discouraged a great many from leaving the comfort of their fire-sides.

To reach the target of 38 points which Manager Allan Brown set recently, five more are still required, and the hope is that two will come as the result of this afternoon's visit by Barrow.

After their narrow defeat at Crewe on Wednesday which brought to an end a run of six matches without defeat, Barrow will be doubly anxious not to

slip up again today, otherwise, their promotion prospects could become severely damaged.

That they are a very good side is obvious from their away record which is easily the best in the Fourth Division and compares favourably with that of any team in the country.

On the other hand, we are well aware of what our lads can do on the Kenilworth Road pitch when conditions favour them and it was obvious on Wednesday that they relished the return to the softer going, as a change from the hard, dusty pitches on which they had their recent unproductive run.

Extra incentive for our players today is the knowledge that they will be facing two tough away games in the space of three days next week-end.

On Saturday, we are due at Bradford for a match that has assumed vital proportions and then, on Monday week, comes the return at Southend where the 'Seasiders' will doubtless be all out for revenge.

Waterlogged grounds caused the postponement of both the reserve team matches scheduled for this week, against Charlton, at home, on Monday, and at Southend on Wednesday.

Fortunately, there was a blank week for this team in hand and we will now go to Southend in the Mid-week League on Tuesday, April 25th, and Charlton will come here on Thursday, April 27th.

With each club playing the other four times in this competition, Charlton will also be here next Wednesday, kick-off 7.30 p.m.

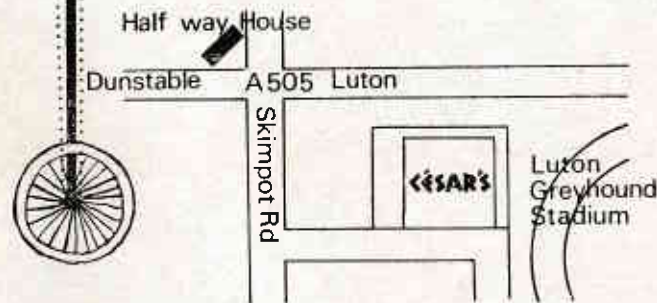
