

LUTON'S ATTACK TAMED

A DETERMINED defensive battle earned Chesterfield a point after they had lost goal-keeper Malcolm Brunt with a head injury.

Brunt was led off the field with blood streaming down his face in the 20th minute, after making a daring save at the feet of Luton's right back Bobby Thomson. His injury needed four stitches.

Wing half Jerry Clarke took over in goal and immediately made a fine save from John Moore. Chesterfield often pulled nine men back into an "iron curtain" defence and restricted Luton's scoring attempts to hopeful long-range shots.

Centre forward Ivan Hollett, despite his advantage in height, was played out of the game by centre half Mike Dougan, and only had one chance at goal—a header that went narrowly wide.

Bill Stark provided a few deft touches, but Andy Wilson, Tony Moore, and Peter Bishop were right out of touch.

Luton, on the other hand, played an attacking game from the start, and rarely let up. Graham French was always a menace on the right wing, and the inside forwards roamed intelligently.
