The performance against Exeter was far from convincing, but after a goalless first half we managed to take the lead after 59 minutes when Ivan Hollett put in a shot and Kevin Randall deflected it into the net.

The visitors were the far more lively side, and on the balance of the play we were a trifle lucky to get away with both points.

We entered the return game with Chester expecting to reverse the 2—I decision at Sealand Road, but luck was not with us, and in addition we missed one or two chances by not moving quick enough in the approach work.

Three times the ball was cleared off the Chester line when a goal seemed certain, but generally it was not a good game, and the visitors managed to score twice and complete the double over us.

Our inside-forwards were given little room in which to work due to Chester packing their own goal area.

SALTERGATE CHATTER—continued

This is Luton's final away game of the season, and so far they have won only once on opponents' grounds and drawn three times.

In their 22 away games to date they have only scored 12 times and had 50 goals scored against them.

Luton Town became members of the Football League for the first time in 1897/98 season, and were admitted to the Second Division.

They only lasted three seasons, however, and it was not until the Third Division South was formed in 1920/21 that they gained a place.

They managed to keep going this time, and in 1936/37 won promotion to the Second Division. The "Hatters" successfully held their status and in 1954/55 gained promotion to the First Division.

Season 1959/60 was the start of a big slump. Obtaining only 30 points they dropped back into the Second Division, and at the end of the 1962/63 campaign were relegated to the Third Division.

The slide continued, and season 1965/66 saw them competing for the first time in the Fourth Division.

Their fortunes changed slightly, and after a much better season they only just missed regaining a place in the Third Division on goal-average.

On April 13th, 1936, Luton Town defeated Bristol Rovers 12—0 in a Third Division South game, with Joe Payne, moved to the centre-forward position for the first time, claiming 10 of the goals.

The following season, Payne, by now a recognised centreforward, scored 55 goals in 39 matches.

On Monday night we receive Port Vale in the last of our home matches this season with the incentive of having won 3—2 on their ground last October.

They appear to have improved somewhat since then, and are expected to give us a tough game.

Meanwhile our Reserves, after going down 5—2 against West Bromwich Reserves at The Hawthorns—Tony Moore and Tony Bartley scoring—gained their ninth win when they beat Sheffield Wednesday Reserves 3—2.

The "Owls" took the lead after six minutes, but goals by Ivan Hollett—dropped from the first team—and Gerry Clarke—put us ahead after 13 minutes. Young Warnock added a third after 24 minutes.

A very interesting game was witnessed at Saltergate on Wednesday evening—our "Reserves" versus Leeds United Reserves—when, after a dour struggle, we managed to obtain the points with a 2—1 victory. This young Leeds side, strong, virile, fast-moving, were one of the best sides seen at Saltergate this season. Sears and Clarke (penalty) were our scorers.
