


MANAGER'S NOTES—


A warm welcome to all Wrexham fans at the start of the 1967-68 season.

Finally may I thank the supporters and administrative staff for the help I received since joining the Club last May. Don't forget to keep cheering and your encouragement is always appreciated by the players.






SUPPORTERS' ASSOCIATION NOTES (by J. H. Williams, President)


