

LUTON TRIUMPH

There was a shock start to Town's League Cup replay at Charlton last night. The Town conceded a goal in the first minutes, TEES scoring from Glover's centre.

The Town were without both full-backs, Hare and Jardine, because of injury, and McDerment was pulled back to partner Slough. Allen was at right-half, Brown at inside-right, and Green passed a late fitness test to lead the attack.

The Town fought back and were unlucky when Allen slammed a great shot inches wide. Wright saved well from Allen and French, and the Town deservedly equalised through RIOCH after 36 min-

utes, following a pass by Brown. When Charlton replied Read made splendid clearances, but the Town were always in the picture in a hard-fought match punctuated by too much whistle for minor offences. Half-time:
