

Luton rocked by Gilfillan verve

Doncaster ... 2 Luton ... 0

DONCASTER chalked up their second successive 2-0 home win last night, but for a long time it looked odds on a goalless draw.

Neither they nor Luton appeared to have a forward capable of breaking through strong defences, even though the

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visitors had the high-scoring Rioch in their attack, while Doncaster had Jeffrey in theirs.

But just as supporters were beginning to complain loudly, things changed. After only a few likely scoring efforts for 70 minutes—Whittaker and Buxton had gone close for Luton—Doncaster suddenly got right on top.

Their Scottish winger, Gilfillan, broke away down the middle, and after Read had half-stopped his shot, he got a second chance and slammed the ball past a wall of defenders on the Luton goal-line.

From then on it was all Doncaster, and it came as no surprise when they made it 2-0 four minutes from the end.

Again Gilfillan got away down the middle but this time, after drawing Read, he flicked the ball sideways to Watson, 18, for the winger to drive the ball into an empty net.
