HEN EWS and VIEWS

The thrills and excitement of Cup Football once again and so we welcome to the County Ground, our friends from Luton Town.

The two clubs have met before in the competition. In 1951-52 they ended one of our finest cup-runs, but in season 1962-63, we visited Kenilworth Road, after two postponements due to frost and snow and won by three goals to one, only to be defeated a few days later on the County Ground by the famous Everton team five goals to one.

Like Swindon Town, Luton Town (The Hatters) were members of the Southern League from 1900-1919 and were one of the originals when Division III South was formed in 1920. Actually they were our opponents on the County Ground, for the opening fixture in the new league. The result 9—1 in our favour. The following Monday, Swindon Town, lost 0—4 at Southampton and in the return fixture at Luton were defeated 0—2.

Luton Town finally gained promotion to Division II by winning the Championship of Division III (South) in Season 1936-37. When football was resumed after the World War II in 1946, they continued in Division II until Season 1954-55, when as runners-up they gained promotion to Division I. They then became one of the leading clubs in the country even appearing in the Final of the F.A. Cup. Up to 1959 Luton Town had gone up and up, and never once been relegated.

Unfortunately with defeat in the Cup, came a quick decline and in Season 1959-60, they were in twenty-second position with 30 points and goal average of 50-73 and so lost Division I status. As so often happens, when a club strikes a bad patch, matters did not improve and in Season 1962-63, Luton Town

found themselves in twenty-second position again, but this time in Division II, points 29, goal average 61-84.

He was named in the last "English Squad", and is often referred to as being on the fringe of "International Honours". Another great-hearted player, who never lacked effort. 


SUPPORTERS CLUB NOTES






