### LUTON TOWN WHO'S WHO

- **Keith ALLEN** (inside-forward). Joined the club from Stockport County in exchange for Derek Kevan in March, 1967, and quickly became a favourite. Has seen service with Grimsby Town and Portsmouth.
- Ken BEAVEN (winger). Is on the club's apprentice staff and is a local boy.
- **Terry BRANSTON** (centre-half). Has figured in all four divisions of the Football League. Signed from Northampton Town, for whom he played regularly.
- Micky BROWN (forward). Comes from Slough and spent five seasons with Fulham, followed by two with Millwall. Luton signed him in July, 1967.
- Max DOUGAN (half-back). When with Scottish club Queen's Park, he gained five amateur international caps. Subsequently went to Leicester City and cost Luton a fairly big fee in December, 1966.
- Graham FRENCH (winger). Has had a lot of experience, as he has played for Shrewsbury, Swindon, Watford and Wellington before joining Luton in October, 1965. Has several Youth international caps for England.
- Tommy HARE (full-back). A Scottish player who went to Luton from Southampton last July.
- Freddie JARDINE (full-back). Another Scot, who played for Dundee before going to Luton in 1961. Was originally an outside-left but has made a successful switch to full-back.
- Brian JOHNSON (winger). One of the club's younger players who has made first team appearances. Was on Sunderland books when Luton signed him.
- **Peter MOONEY** (winger). A local boy who is an apprentice professional and has done well in the reserve side,
- John MOORE (wing-half). A Scottish player who used to play for Motherwell and is now in his third season at Luton.
- Billy McDERMENT (wing-half). Yet another player from over the border. Was a Leicester City personality before going to Luton last July.
- Tony READ (goalkeeper). Started his League career with Sheffield Wednesday and then went to Peterborough, from whom Luton signed him in March, 1965. Can also play effectively at centre-forward.
- **Bruce RIOCH** (inside-forward). A talented young player who has attracted attention. Joined Luton as an apprentice in 1963, became a full-time professional a year later and has become a force in the attack.
- Neil RIOCH (half-back). A brother of Bruce who joined the club straight from school 18 months ago and is on the apprentice staff.
- Alan SLOUGH (full-back). A product of Luton local football who has graduated through schoolboy, amateur and apprentice ranks before becoming a full-timer nearly three years ago. Can also play at wing-half and inside-forward.
- Ray WHITTAKER (winger). A Londoner who played for Arsenal, with whom he gained England Youth international caps before going to Luton in March, 1964.
- Robin WAINWRIGHT (inside-forward). Another local player who became an apprentice professional in July last year. Played several times for England Boys' Club last season.
