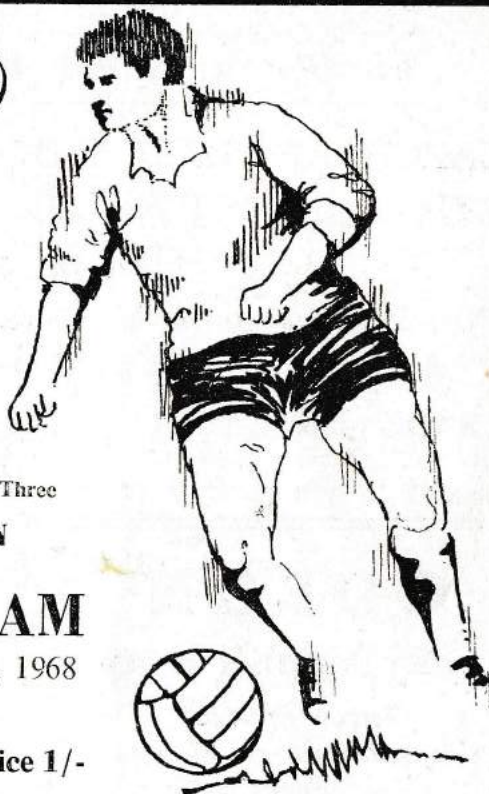

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CLUB NOTES

AFTER the splendid start the team has made to the season in which they have yet to concede a goal, there is every justification for approaching this afternoon's home encounter with Rotherham United with confidence.

Rotherham, of course, are old Second Division opponents of ours and their manager, Tommy Docherty, who earned fame with Chelsea, was here last week to run the rule over the team when we played Watford.

Expectations are that the Yorkshire club, who were relegated at the end of last season, will be among the front-runners for promotion and this afternoon's meeting should provide an interesting trial of strength.

If the crowd that was drawn for the visit of Watford can be taken as a guide, then the attendance may well be the biggest we have had on a Saturday for a very long time.

Incidentally, in the next round of the League Cup, we are due to visit Brighton a week next Wednesday and tickets are available at the club offices at 7/6, 10/- and 12/6.

Before that, we have another home match next Wednesday, kick-off 7.30,

with the attractive Barnsley team who accompanied us out of the Fourth Division at the end of last season.

Next Saturday there is a visit to Gillingham and for that, if things have gone right in the meantime, we expect to have a very big following.

Many complaints have been received about the foul language which is being used by a section of the crowd at the Oak Road end of the ground and a strong appeal is made for this to be moderated.

It is offensive to many people who come to enjoy a good game of football without having to listen to bawdy songs and abuse of the referee.

Unless there is an improvement in this behaviour, stern action will have to be taken, as it will about the senseless throwing of toilet rolls on to the pitch.

Another aggravating habit, mainly of the younger supporters is the running on to the pitch at the end of the match. During the close season, a considerable amount of money was spent on renovating the surface and the running over the grass by hundreds of people can cause more damage than in an entire match.

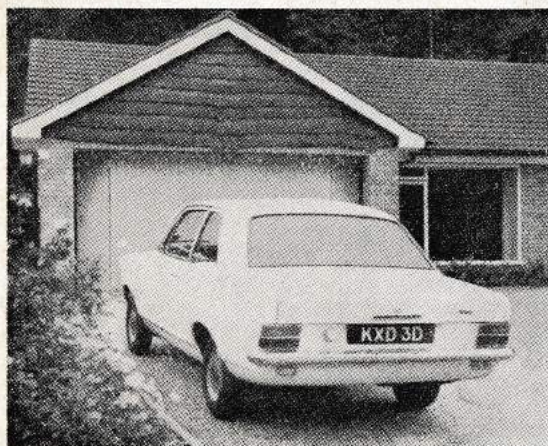


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PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Alan Hill (goalkeeper). Alan was signed from local club, Barnsley F.C., in season 1966 for a fee of £12,000 and has been a regular First Team choice ever since.

Mick Harrity (full back). Mick signed as an amateur and subsequently joined the full time professional staff in 1963. Mick played frequently in the First Team last season.

Dennis Leigh (full back). Dennis joined the club in February, 1968, featuring in an exchange deal with his club colleague, G. Watson, for players Clish, Wilcockson and Rabjohn, and is now a regular member of United's First Team pool. Dennis is a play-anywhere sort of player and is completely at home whatever his position may be.

John Quinn (wing half). John was Manager Docherty's first Professional signing from Sheffield Wednesday in November, 1967, for a fee of £28,000 and his considerable League experience is proving valuable to the present First Team youngsters.

David Watson (wing half). David featured in an exchange deal with Notts County for Welsh International K. Pring, and, since making his debut in January, 1968, has established himself as a regular First Team pivot.

Brian Tiler (wing half). Another local born player who signed Professional forms in 1962/63 season after graduating through the amateur ranks. For the past several years Brian has been a regular in the First Team and took over as team captain at the beginning of last season.

Graham Leggatt (forward). Graham, needless to say, requires no introduction having played consistently for Fulham F.C. for over 10 years and latterly with Birmingham City F.C., who released him at the end of last season and was readily snapped-up by Manager Docherty to give him a

balance of youth and experience in his first eleven.

James Storrie (forward). Jim was the second of Manager Docherty's signings for a fee of £9,000 from Aberdeen in December, 1967 and, like his team mate John Quinn, was one of the bargain buys of the season. Jim is the sort of player always likely to pop-up when least expected.

Alan Gilliver (forward). He has not had the opportunity to show his capabilities in League football but has played in all pre-season practice matches and should add obvious talent and weight to the forward line. Alan featured in a straight swap deal from Blackburn Rovers F.C. with player, Les Chappell, in May, 1968.

David Bentley (forward). David signed Professional in July 1967, after a 12 month's probationary period with the ground staff. Like his team mate, Neil Hague, he travelled with the International Under 23 team to play Ireland in Dublin and Portsmouth. David matured tremendously whilst playing in the First Team squad has sufficient potential to warrant his membership of the First Team pool.

John Shepherd (forward). John is another local born player who joined United in May, 1966 and last season was a regular member of the First Team from Manager Docherty taking over the Managerial chair in 1967. John is exceptionally adept ball player and has a flair for doing the unorthodox.

Steven Downes (forward). Steven graduated from the amateur ranks in January, 1967, and 4 months later signed full time Professional forms. Steven is another of United's First Team pool and has readily adapted himself to First Team requirements having played very frequently in the first eleven last term, including the Cup-Ties with Aston Villa and Leicester City.

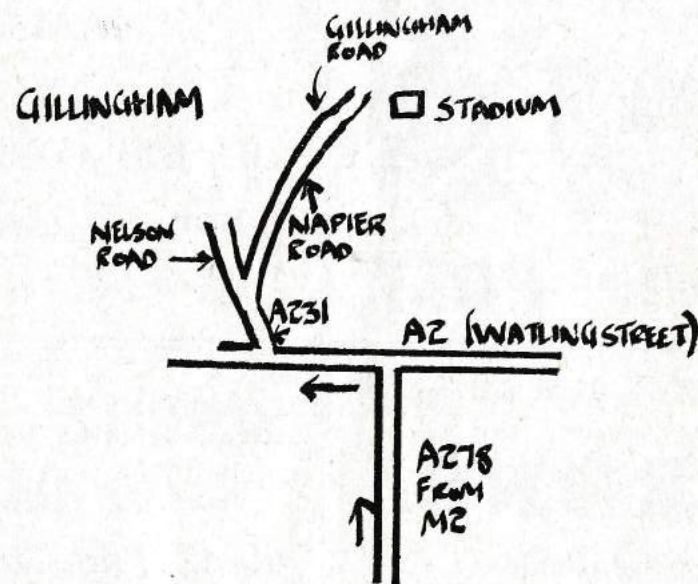

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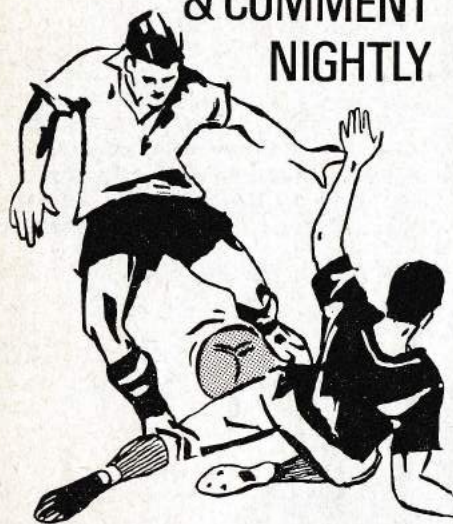

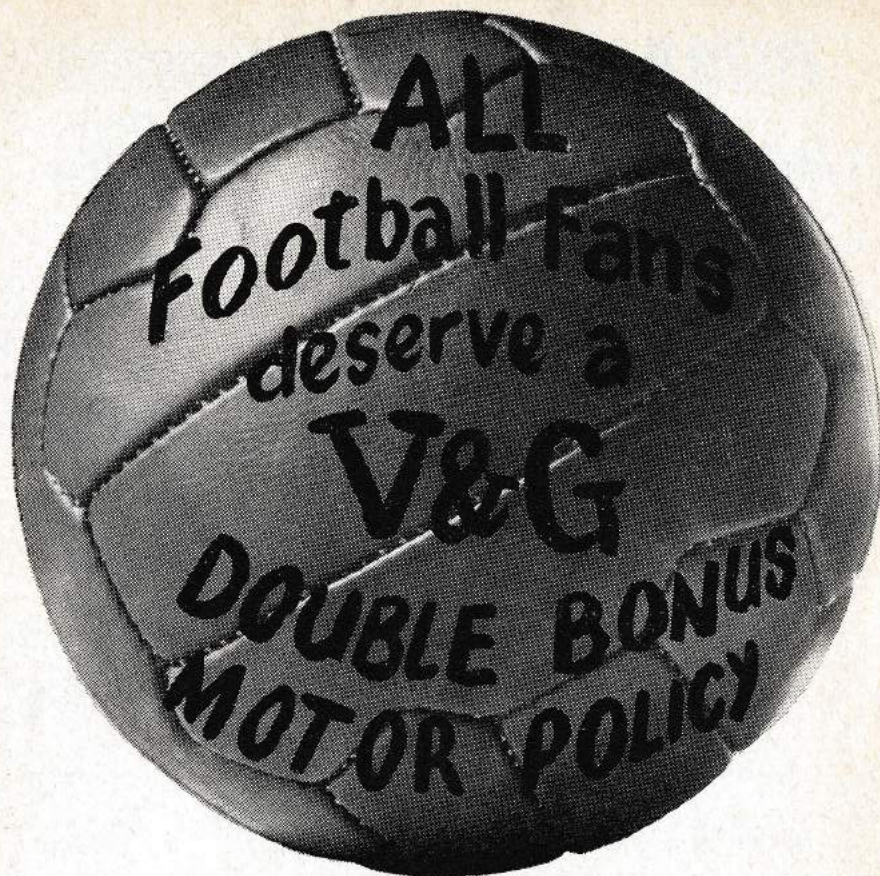
