CLUB NOTES

HAVING now gone eight matches without defeat, there is supreme confidence in the camp that this record can be maintained by overcoming Brighton tonight.

In fact, there is much at stake from the monetary point of view in that the winners are due to meet Everton at Goodison Park on Tuesday week and the financial reward from that should be considerable.

If we do win, supporters who intend making the trip to Liverpool can apply to our Kenilworth Road offices for stand tickets, priced at 9s, 10s, and 12s. There will be an adequate supply for all who wish to go.

One matter of encouragement is the size of the following which is going to away matches. The number of supporters at Orient on Saturday was even greater than that which went to Gillingham the previous week and the vocal support is much appreciated by the team.

The point which was gained was hard earned and had a little more luck attended scoring attempts by Bruce Ritch, Laurie Sheffield and Brian Lewis, there would have been another victory to record.

It was by no means a great match, but the players blamed the bumpy surface of the pitch for many of the mistakes that were made. There has been some criticism of the defensive tactics adopted, but it should be emphasised that this was merely a case of playing it tight and marking closely.

Complaints were also made about the operation of the offside trap, but

it should be pointed out that the onus is on the opposition to break it down if they can.

This is the first of three consecutive home matches, the next being on Saturday when Trammere Rovers, with whom we have had some hard tussles in the past, being the visitors.

On the following Wednesday, Mansfield Town, who are currently second to us in the League table will provide the opposition, and this looks like being a really exciting tussle.

In an attempt to prevent possible trouble, barriers have been erected at right angles to the pitch at the Oak Road end. Effect of this will be to give free access through a narrow passage on the terrace for the police should it become necessary for them to go into the crowd.

Will supporters please note that this avenue must be kept clear at all times, otherwise the object of it is defeated completely.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Tony Burns (goalkeeper). Joined the club from Arsenal in July 1966. Played for South West Kent Schoolboys before joining Tonbridge as an amateur. Was with Arsenal for three years. Born at Edenbridge, Kent.

Stewart Henderson (full back). Came to Brighton from Chelsea in October, 1965. Played for school team — St. Modans High School, Stirling — and for Stirlingshire Schoolboys. Won three Scottish Schoolboys Caps at right back. Born at Bridge of Allan, Scotland.

Mike Everitt (full back). Born at Clacton, Essex. Played for Clacton Secondary Schools, Essex Schoolboys, London Schoolboys, and in representative match South England Schoolboys v. North England Schoolboys. Straight from school to Arsenal for five years. Then with Northampton Town from 4th to 1st Division.

Norman Gall (full back). Played for Wallsend Boys, then to Corinthians Junior Youth team, before going to Gateshead. Signed from Gateshead in March 1962. Albion's second longest serving player, with the most first team appearances — 232.

Jimmy Magill (full back). Born at Lurgan, Northern Ireland. Played with Carrick Secondary School, and Lurgan Technical College before joining Portadown in Northern Ireland. Then almost seven seasons with Arsenal. Holder of 27 Full Northern Ireland Caps and 1 Under 23 Cap.

John Templeman (half back). Joined club from Portsmouth Juniors in July 1966. Captain of his school team, Westergate Secondary Modern School, near Chichester, Sussex. After leaving school was with Portsmouth Juniors for two seasons.

John Napier (centre half). Born in Lurgan, Northern Ireland. Played with Lurgan Boys Intermediate and went straight from school to Bolton Wanderers from whom he was signed by Brighton in August, 1967. Has 1 Full Northern Ireland International Cap, 2 Under 23 Caps, 11 Youth Caps, 3 Schoolboy Caps.

Dave Turner (half back). Born at Retford, Notts. Played for Notting-

hamshire Schoolboys and had two trials for England Schoolboys. Joined Newcastle United straight from school from which club he signed for Brighton.

Howard Wilkinson (winger). Born in Sheffield. Joined club in July, 1966 from Sheffield Wednesday. Won an England Youth Cap at outside right in 1962. Played for Yorkshire Grammar Schools and for England Grammar Schools.

Nobby Lawton (inside forward). Came to club from Preston North End. Played for Manchester and Lancashire Schoolboys at inside left. Joined Manchester United from school. Played in F.A. Cup Semi-Final for United against Spurs in 1961. Was captain of Preston North End when they lost to West Ham in F.A. Cup Final in 1963/64 season. Born in Manchester.

Kit Napier (inside forward). Born at Dunblane, Scotland. Played for South and East Scotland Schoolboys. Previous clubs Preston, Blackpool and Workington before joining Newcastle United from whom he was signed by Brighton in September, 1966. Last season broke Brighton's post-war scoring record with 24 League goals, 3 League Cup goals and 1 F.A. Cup goal.

Charlie Livesey (inside forward). Born at West Ham. Played for West Ham Boys. Signed with Wolves as an amateur after leaving school. Then as a professional with Southampton. Also played for Chelsea, Gillingham and Watford. Signed by the club from Northampton Town in September 1965.

Paul Flood (winger). Born in Dublin. Joined Brighton from Bohemians, Dublin. Won Eire Schoolboys Cap against England, Eire Youth Cap and Amateur International Cap. Started career as an apprentice at Coventry but returned to Bohemians.

Brian Tawse (forward). Joined club in December 1965 from Arsenal. Joined Arsenal as an amateur direct from school and was with them for 3 years. Born at Ellon, Scotland.

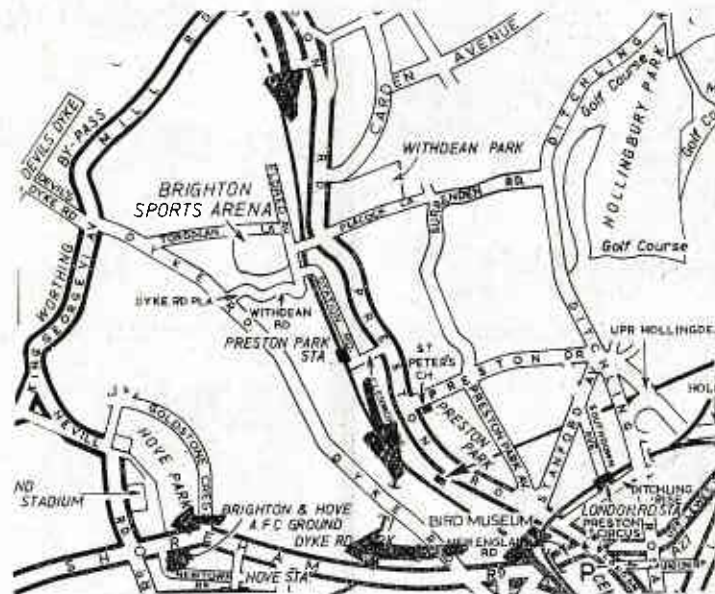

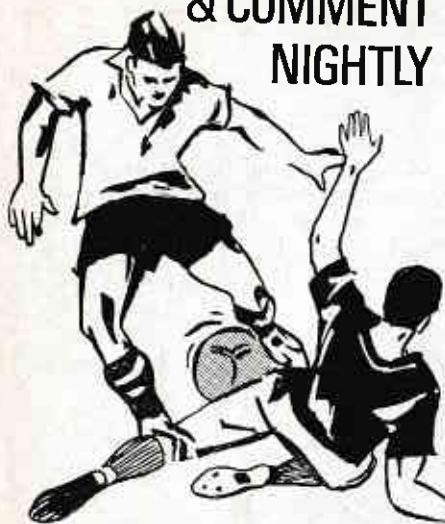

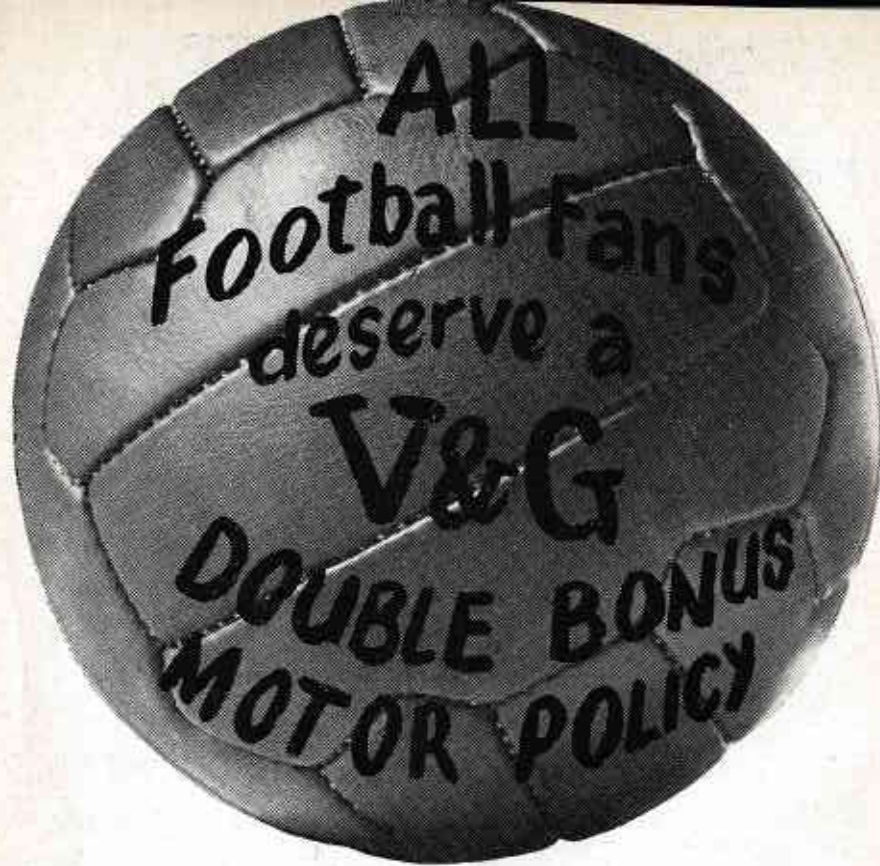
