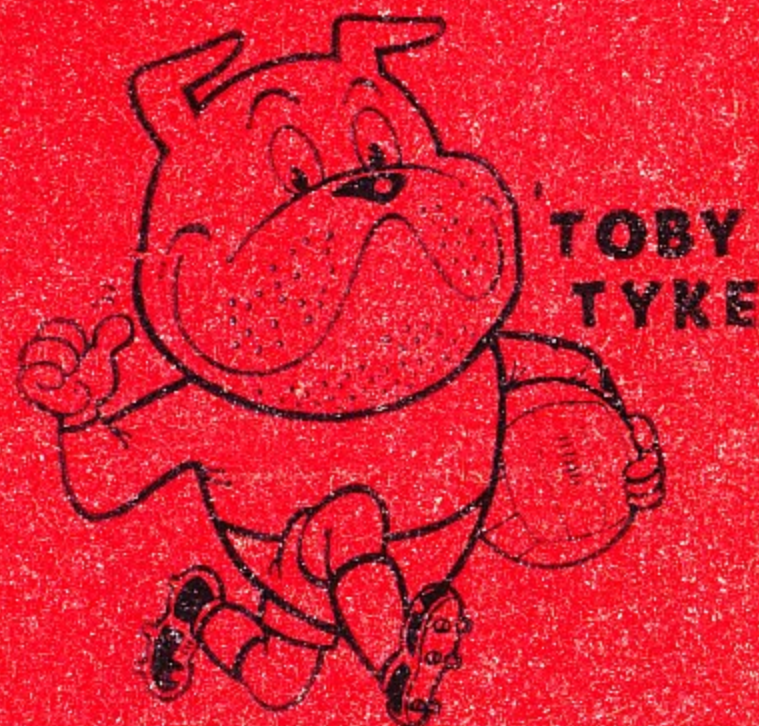

**FROM THE
MANAGER'S
OFFICE**

There is no escaping from the fact that we had a most disappointing start to the season, and I must admit I felt apprehensive as we sank to the foot of the table. However recent results suggest that the tide is turning.

Our last five matches, three of which have been away, have produced six points, our only defeat coming at Torquay, where the 3—1 scoreline presented a gross distortion of a game in which we had nearly all the play but no luck.

In the last three matches our defence has been so dominant that we have not conceded a single goal. We had goalless draws away to Plymouth and Shrewsbury and beat Brighton 4—0 at home.

That Brighton game gave me good cause for satisfaction. The players showed a determination and persistence that delighted me, and, I'm sure, delighted you too. All of them gave 100 per cent effort throughout, and no-one can ask for more.

There is no use pretending that the Shrewsbury game reached anything like this standard. But I do challenge some reports which give the impression that we were completely negative in our approach.

Of course we pulled every available man back when Shrewsbury attacked. Of course we were happy to take a point.

But we played to win . . . not merely to avoid defeat.

If we were so negative, how come that of the three corners awarded in the first 25 minutes all were for Barnsley?

If we were so negative, how come that home goalkeeper John Phillips was a busier man than Roy Ironside.

And if we were so negative how come Johnny Evans (twice), Jimmy Robson and Dave Booth all came within an ace of scoring the winner?

However, having said that, it must be admitted that we did not play well. It was not a game worth remembering.

A better indication of our improvement can be measured by tonight's match against league leaders Luton Town. Remember we lost 5—1 at Kenilworth Road in August, when, after the first 20 minutes, we were swept aside by the powerful home team.

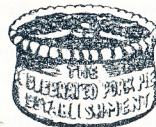
If we win tonight then I will be confident that we can continue our climb up the table.

We will not be completely out of the wood. But we will be able to see daylight once again.

Finally, a plea to our younger fans. Much as we appreciate your support, we cannot tolerate such incidents as the one during the Brighton game in which a Brighton supporter was punched by a group of so-called Barnsley fans.

I have always said that here at Oakwell we have some of the best fans in the country. Please don't let this good name be tarnished by isolated outbreaks of violence.

LUTON TOWN

Few clubs have slipped more rapidly than Luton Town, right from the top flight to the foot of Division Four, but under former Scottish International Allan Brown they have showed equally rapid improvement.

Wise investments in the transfer market have repayed rich dividends and they have fully realised their potential as one of the Third Division's pace-setters.

So far they have suffered only two defeats—away to Brighton and Watford—and have taken 16 points from their 11 matches. Their home record is particularly impressive: played six, won six, goals for 20, goals against 5.

Five of those goals came against Barnsley in the first encounter at Kenilworth Road last month. That 5—1 victory sent the "Hatters" soaring to the top of the table. There can be little doubt, then, that the Red's will be flat out for revenge tonight.

In last season's matches, when both teams won promotion from Division Four, Luton as champions and Barnsley as runners-up, the Bedfordshire side took three points from the Oakwell Club, winning 2—0 at home and holding the Reds to a 2—2 draw here at Oakwell.

And if tonight's match is anywhere near as entertaining as that latter game then we are in for a real treat. It was undoubtedly one of the best clashes of the season.

Star personality in the powerful Luton line-up is inside-forward Bruce Rioch, a goal-grabbing 21-year-old who is currently attracting the attentions of many top clubs.

Those fans who made the trip to Luton this term will remember his magnificent goal when he ran threequarters of the length of the field in a sparkling solo run before hitting the ball hard into the net. He also netted with a gem of a shot at Oakwell last campaign, when he finished leading marksman with 24 goals.

So far this season, however, he is being out-gunned by Brian Lewis, who currently leads the Third Division scoring charts with 10 goals.

At centre-forward Town have former Doncaster Rovers player Laurie Sheffield, signed during the close season from Oldham Athletic. Here is another forward capable of scoring a lot of goals.

King-pin of the defence is skipper and centre-half Terry Branston, who last season became a member of a promotion side for the fourth time in his career, having previously accompanied Northampton Town in their rise from Division Four to Division One.

No doubt his ambition is to do the same with Luton.

PEN PICTURES

TONY READ (Goalkeeper): Looked at one time as though he would make a name for himself in the forward line and probably holds the distinction of being the only goalkeeper to have scored a hat-trick in League football. Born Haydock and began his career with Sheffield Wednesday before moving to Peterborough.

MAX DOUGAN (Right-back): Allan Brown's first signing for the club. Joined Luton for around £7,000 from Leicester City. A Scottish amateur international when with Queen's Park.

FREDDIE JARDINE (Left-back): In his eighth season with Luton. Came as an outside-left when Sam Bartram was in charge. Converted into a very useful defender.

ALAN SLOUGH (Right-half): An amateur and apprentice with Luton before signing full-time. Originally a full-back.

TERRY BRANSTON (Centre-half): An ever-present in last season's promotion team. Born Rugby, he spent nine seasons with Northampton Town, accompanying them in their rise from Division Four to Division One.

BILLY McDERMENT (Left-half): Signed from Leicester City as a right-back, made most of his 20 appearances last at left-back and this season has played well at left-half.

BRIAN LEWIS (Inside-right): Town's most expensive signing for years when transferred from Coventry City. He has also played with Portsmouth. Equally at home in the wing-half spot. Top scorer this season.

LAURIE SHEFFIELD (Centre-forward): One of Town's big close season signings from Oldham Athletic. Born Swansea and previously with five other League club's.

BRUCE RIOCH (Inside-left): Twenty-one last month, he is Town's biggest asset as a player. Leading scorer with 24 goals last season. Born Aldershot, but spent most of his schooldays in Luton and has been with Town since he was 15.

MIKE HARRISON (Outside-left): Signed for £7,000 from Plymouth Argyle. Born Ilford, began his first-class career with Chelsea, from which club he moved on to Blackburn Rovers.

KEITH ALLEN (Utility player): Signed from Stockport County and had previous spells with Portsmouth and Grimsby Town. Can play equally well in attack or wing-half.

RAY WHITTAKER (Winger): Formerly with Arsenal with whom he gained England Youth International Caps. Joined Luton in 1964.

Sixteen goals in the last two matches. That is the proud record of our Reserve team in the North Midlands League. After disappointing results in the Cup competition they have really gone to town in no uncertain manner now that the league tourney is underway.

First to come under the hammer were Mansfield Town . . . and on their own ground too. They crashed 9—1 as the Reds revelled in the slippery conditions.

As the scoreline suggests we attacked incessantly, our smaller forwards running riot, and had it not been for some splendid saves by the Mansfield goalkeeper we could easily have broken into double figures.

MEET THE MANAGER ALLAN BROWN



. . . who has taken Luton from the foot of Division Four to the top of Division Three. A former Scottish international and one of the finest post-war inside-forwards, he is proving to be as good a manager as he was a player.

A LOOK AT LUTON'S ACE GOALSCORER

Twenty-one last month, Luton inside-forward Bruce Rioch (pictured overleaf) has already attracted bids topping £30,000 . . . but manager Allan Brown has so far resisted all temptations to part with his star player in the belief that Rioch has a vital role to play in the Luton revival.

Says Mr. Brown: "We here at Luton know we have a jewel. He hits goals from all angles, he moves with an easy grace that is the true mark of a star."

Bruce himself is modest and polite. He says: "I have no real interest in life outside my wife and football. Every day I come back to Kenilworth Road in the afternoon with my younger brother Neil, who is also on the staff. And we practice. He floats the ball across to me and I practice shooting . . . hour after hour. We love it.

"I was told when I was young that practice makes perfect. It's true as far as football is concerned. I have luck to have power in my feet and I am learning how to use that power, no matter how the ball comes to me, no matter how little time I have to snap up the chance.

"I'm still very young. I reckon that it is a lot harder in the Third Division this season than it was in the Fourth Division last.

"I often wonder when I see a top star like Bobby Charlton finding space and time to score those cracking goals in the real top flight how I would fare in the same circumstances . . . and I know I must keep on practising."

Bruce loves his home life and television and pop records.

But most of all he loves his football.

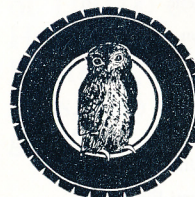
