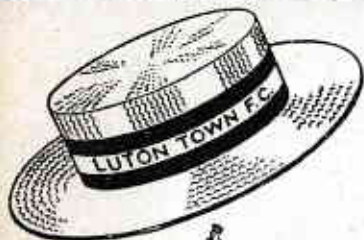

CLUB NOTES

BECAUSE of the weather, there has been a gap of five weeks since we last had the opportunity of seeing the First Team play at Kenilworth Road. Frost and snow knocked out our Boxing Day fixture with Watford, and the meeting with Crewe a fortnight ago, was put off by fog.

New date for the local derby with Watford which may well bring a capacity crowd, is Wednesday, 19th February, and Crewe will come here on the following Wednesday.

In the meantime, we have another mid-week commitment next Wednesday when we go to Crewe for the match postponed on 2nd November through the pitch being waterlogged.

So, a crowded programme is now facing the players, especially as the Reserves also have extra commitments through matches being off.

In this respect, it is highly satisfactory that our playing strength was increased this week by the signing of Mike Keen, the Queens Park Rangers wing half, who led them on their march from Division III to Division I.

Keen, of course, begins his second spell under the management of Alec

Stock, and he makes his debut against Walsall this afternoon, a fact that should have served to increase substantially the size of the attendance.

To acquire this vastly experienced player cost us a fee bordering on £20,000 and is an earnest, if one were needed, of the determination there is to gain admission to the Second Division.

While there is still leeway to be made up in the promotion race, recent results have served to open up the issue and there is no doubt that a consistent run beginning now, will put us firmly among the leading contenders.

Certainly, there is concrete evidence of a marked improvement in the away form, as was instanced when we became only the second team to return from Swindon with a point, which was a very good performance indeed.

Next Saturday, there is another attractive match here, when Reading provide the opposition but first, there is the Crewe hurdle to surmount and, on comparative form, we should earn some reward on their Gresty Road ground.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Bob Wesson (goalkeeper). Bob was signed from Coventry City in 1966. He made some 150 First XI appearances for the 'Sky Blues.' Born in Thornaby-on-Tees.

John Burckitt (full back). John, an experienced defender, joined the 'Saddlers' from Coventry City in the close season. A former Youth International he made his debut for the 'Sky Blues' in 1964.

John Harris (full back). John an Under 23 International and Club Captain, has made only spasmodic appearances during the last two seasons due to a serious injury. Now playing again and hoping to recover his regular First XI place. He came from Wolverhampton Wanderers in 1965. Born in nearby Upper Gornal.

Nick Atthey (wing half). Nick was signed as apprentice professional on leaving school and became a full time professional in 1963. Small in stature he is noted for his non-stop power house performances. Born in Tanby, Newcastle-on-Tyne.

Stan Bennett (centre half). A Birmingham boy who served his apprenticeship with the 'Saddlers.' Stan seized his chance when Trevor Smith, the Club's International centre half, was seriously injured. A dedicated, whole hearted player.

Trevor Meath (wing half). Another local boy, signed from Darlston as a professional in 1964. Trevor is a powerful player, well-built and strong in the tackle. Always ready to join in the attack.

Geoff Morris (winger). "Twinkle-toes" Geoff served his apprenticeship with the 'Saddlers' and became a full time professional in 1966. A clever, particularly promising youngster.

Allan Baker (inside forward). A much sought after Schoolboy International. Allan was signed from Aston Villa in 1966. A neat, deft player, controlling the ball with

quicksilver accuracy, he is also at home on the wing. Born in nearby Tipton.

Jim Murray (centre forward). After serving Wolverhampton Wand. and Manchester City, Jim joined the 'Saddlers' at the start of last season. An experienced player and prolific goalscorer.

Mike Tindall (inside forward). Mike came from Aston Villa during the close season. The holder of eight Youth Caps, he made over 100 First XI appearances for the Villa.

Tom Watson (winger). Tom joined the 'Saddlers' from Peterborough United early last season and won the 'Player of the Season' award. A particularly fast, storming type of winger, noted for his goal-snatching. Born in Lanarkshire.

Mick Evans (full back). A West Bromwich boy, Mick is another home grown product who signed Amateur forms in 1963 and became a full time professional in 1964. Strong and fearless, he deputised for John Harris the Club Captain, who was seriously injured.

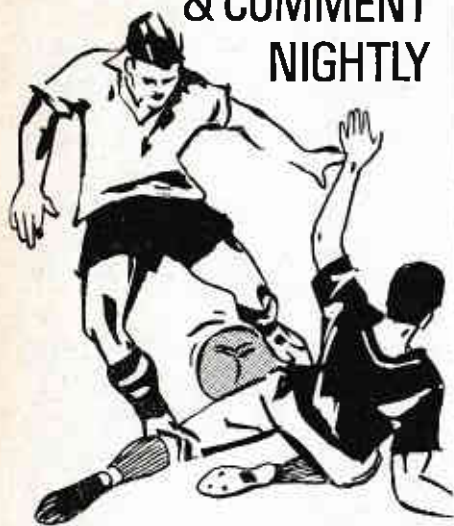

Colin Harrison (wing half). A versatile player, equally at home at inside forward. Colin is yet another 'Saddlers' Nursery babe who became professional in 1963.

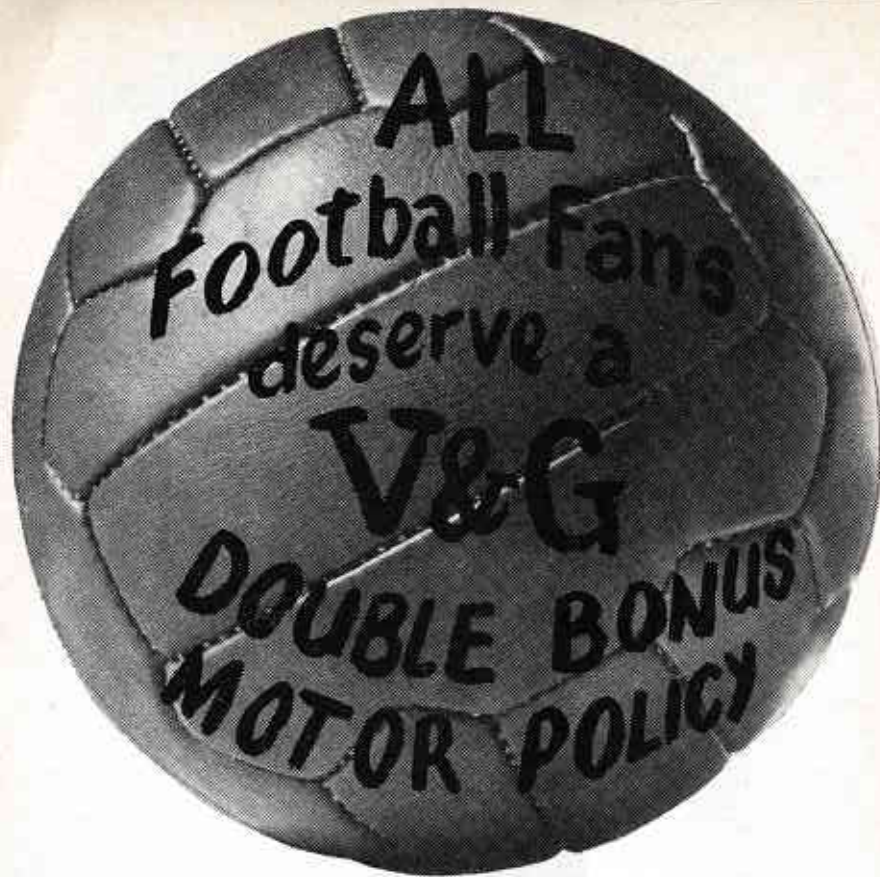

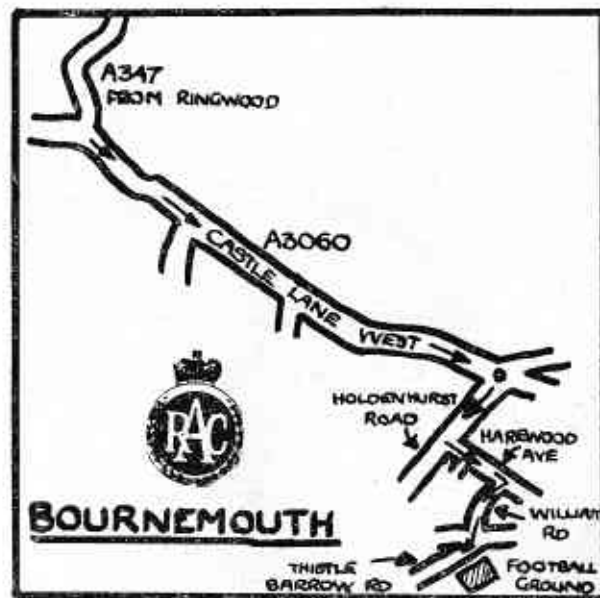
