Luton's pride was bat-tered by their defeat at Crewe on Wednesday night, but their unbeaten home record remained intact for Reading's visit this afternoon.

Luton's defence was unchanged, but French, out midweek with a pulled muscle, returned on the right wing. This meant that Brian Lewis switched back to inside-forward and Keith Allen led the attack.
