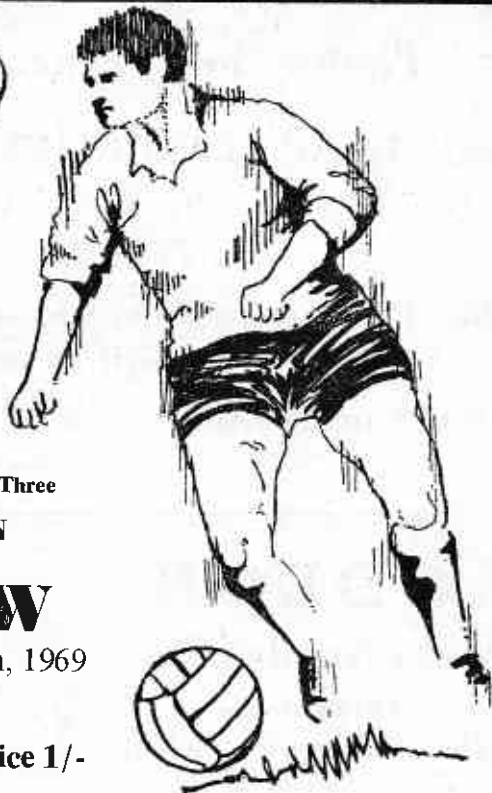

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CLUB NOTES

WHILE there was an unexpected slip on Saturday when we failed to complete a hat-trick of victories over Gillingham, and dropped a point that could ill be afforded, there is no doubt that we are still bang in the promotion race.

Defeats for Watford and Swindon helped ease the fact that a point escaped us, but it is obvious that there must be no further failures in the home matches which remain.

Tonight, the team has an early opportunity to re-establish itself in the eyes of the fans and we hope that two points from tonight's visitors, will be followed by two more when Orient come here on Saturday.

Even though both sets of opponents are in the lower half of the table, Gillingham gave ample evidence on Saturday, that too much should not be read into this, and that the possibility of a surprise can never be discounted.

Manager Alec Stock has inclined towards the view that Saturday's display was 'just one of those things' and he was not anticipating making drastic changes for tonight's match.

Incidentally, both he and the players were much impressed with the vocal encouragement given them on Saturday, and they hope that this will continue. Certainly, there was considerable enthusiasm in the closing stages when the team was fighting, without success, unfortunately, for the winner.

While on the subject of the crowd, we would point out that there was again a lapse in the behaviour of that

section behind the Oak Road goal who will persist in using obscene language. We have appealed on previous occasions for them to cut this out and we do so again.

In assessing our chances of gaining Second Division football for Luton next season, no one is inclined to under-estimate the size of the task.

After Saturday's home game with Orient, three tough, away engagements loom up, beginning with a visit to Bristol next Monday and followed by trips to Torquay and Mansfield at Easter.

This is a very tough assignment, but we are confident that we have the playing resources to contend with it. In the meantime, four more home points will do much to increase the confidence.

All stand tickets for the home match with Watford on Wednesday, 30th April, which will be our final match of the season, have now been sold and this is the second time that this fixture has produced a sell-out this season.

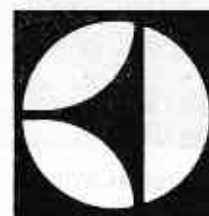

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Fred Else (goalkeeper). Playing as well and confidently as he did in his lengthy spells of service with Blackburn Rovers and Preston North End, Born Golbourne he joined Barrow in the summer of 1966. A man who is a credit to the game. Missed only six games last season.

Terrence McDonald (full back). Although he spent most of last season in the Second Team, he proved a capable deputy. Signed from Southport in July, 1967 he was formerly an apprentice with Middlesbrough, Born Belfast.

James Mallon (full back). Has played consistently well since joining the Club from Greenock Morton in September, 1965. Formerly a forward with Oldham Athletic he has missed very few games for Barrow. Born Glasgow.

Eric Harrison (wing half). A hard defensive player signed from Hartlepool United in 1966 and played in 53 First Team games last season in League and Cup. Born Hebden Bridge he played previously with Halifax Town.

Brian Arrowsmith (centre half). Not big for a centre half, but don't let that fool you. He has blotted out many notable No 9's including Johnnie Byrne and Ron Davies. A local boy who was signed in 1961. A very capable cricketer and golfer.

Mick Hartland (wing half). Proved to be a useful linkman and a player of exceptional football craft when on top form. Signed on a 'free' from Oxford United he is now in his fourth season with Barrow. Still young enough to progress in the game. Played in 38 League games last season for 8 goals. Born Dunfermline.

Roy McCarthy (winger). A very fast raider and a player who has improved tremendously since coming to Barrow from Barnsley in 1964. He is now in his fifth season with the Club and has

been a regular. He scored 7 goals in his 33 appearances last season. Born Barnsley.

Bill McAdams (inside forward). A former Irish International who has worked hard to regain his match fitness after a serious operation. He played a big part in Barrow's promotion in 1966-67. Formerly with Manchester City, Leeds United and Queens Park Rangers. Born Belfast.

George McLean (centre forward). Netted 16 goals for Workington Reds last season and was signed to provide height and strength to the forward line. A player of experience with Norwich City, Grimsby Town and Exeter City and has always been amongst the goals. Born Paisley.

Peter Bebbington (inside forward). Signed for Barrow in November, 1967 from Leicester City his only other League Club and quickly established himself in the First Eleven at both wing half and full back. A good young prospect who could return to First Division football soon. Born Oswestry.

David Storf (winger). The record Barrow Transfer Fee to Rochdale in July, 1967 has proved well worthwhile. Without doubt one of the few good class outside left's in the League. Top goalscorer with 16 League goals last season including a hat-trick. Born Sheffield he started his career with Wednesday.

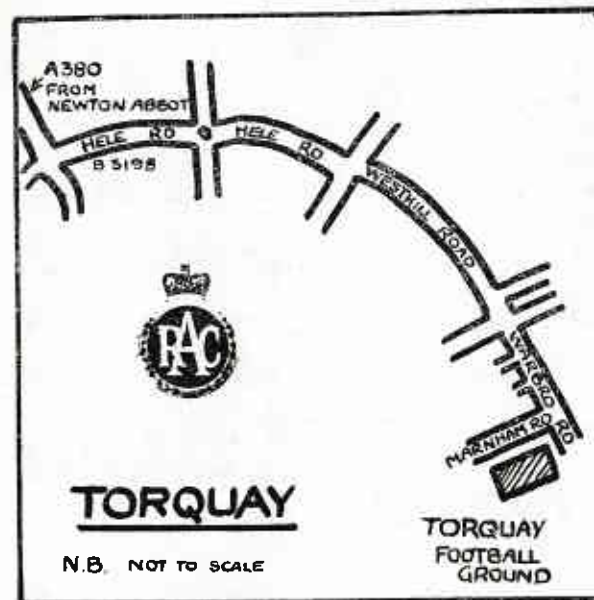

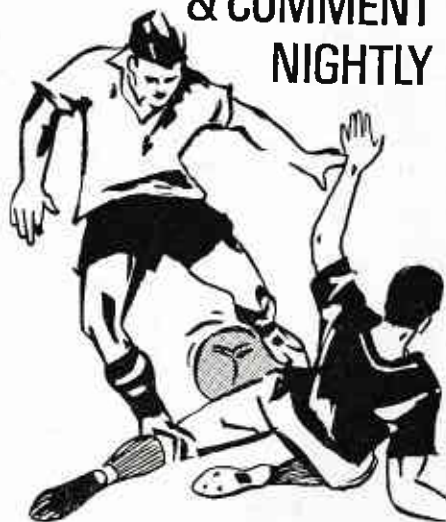

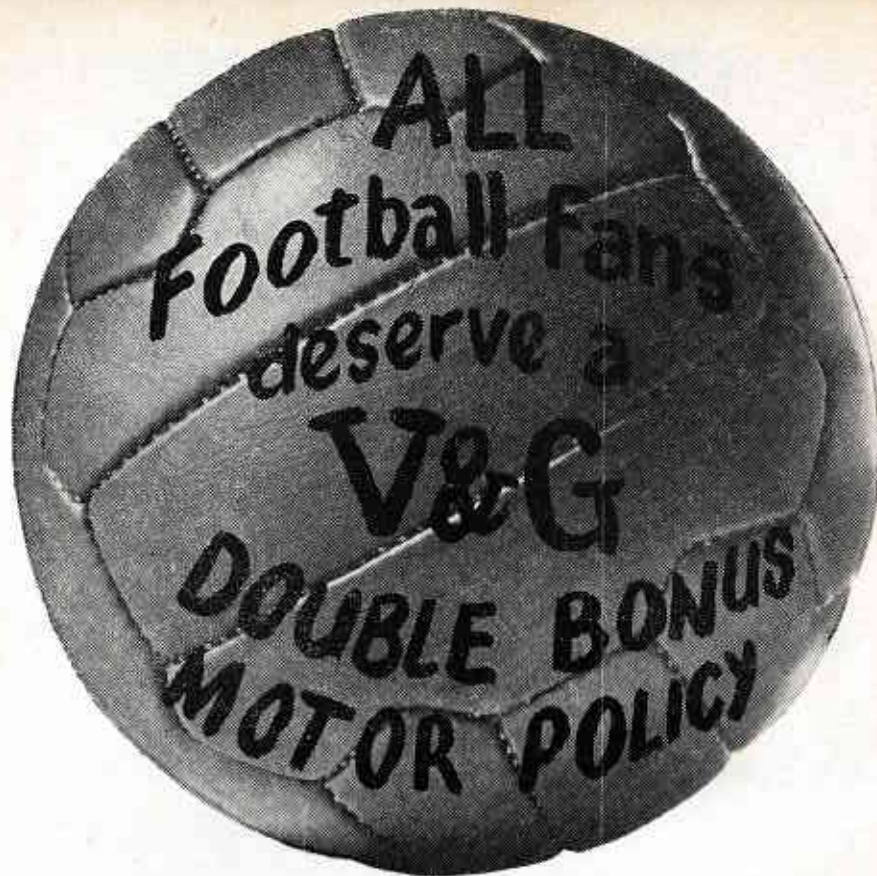
