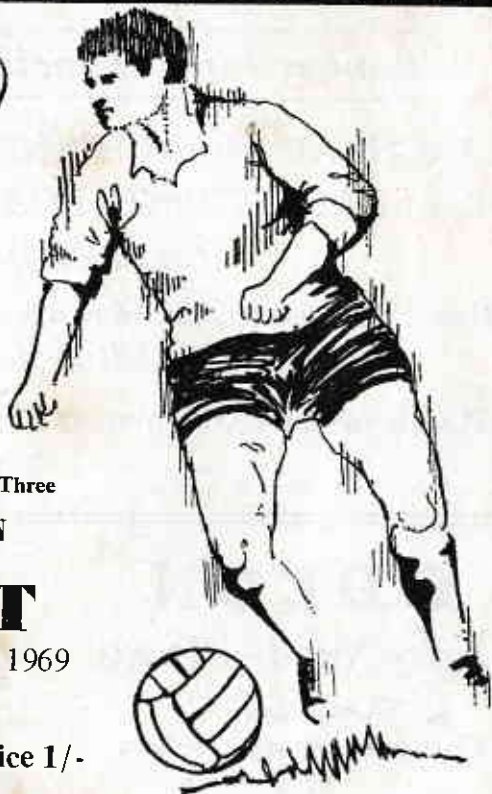

CLUB NOTES

AFTER the rousing victory over Barrow on Wednesday, our best in the League since August 28th, there can be nothing but confidence in facing the last of the four consecutive home matches with Orient as the visitors this afternoon.

Orient, who have been steadily improving under the guidance of the former West Ham inside forward, Jimmy Bloomfield, have now pushed the bogey of relegation which has haunted them to some extent this season, into the background.

Their mid - week victory over Stockport County indicated that they will not be easy to beat and, certainly there will be no disposition on the part of our lads to under-rate the opposition.

Another big win would increase confidence in the task that lies ahead. This is the formidable one of facing three away matches in eight days beginning on Monday when we visit Bristol Rovers, who showed their mettle by scoring six times against Mansfield Town on Tuesday.

After that comes the long trip to Torquay on Friday (7.30), followed by a short breathing space before we are due to visit Mansfield on Easter Monday. For the latter match, supporters should note that the kick-off is timed for 3 p.m. and that the home game with Southport the following day will start at 7.30 p.m.

To complete a hectic period, the Reserves will be at home to Cardiff City on Wednesday week. In this case, a 3 p.m. kick-off has been arranged so as to cut out any question of an overnight stay by the Welsh

club. This will also be the case when the Reserves visit Swansea on Thursday, May 1st.

Incidentally, like the First Team, the Reserves are enjoying a successful run which is getting them away from the lower reaches of the Combination table. They secured a fine 3-0 win at Reading on Wednesday, with the goals coming from Ian Buxton, John Ryan and Morris Stevenson and they went to Southampton today with a run of six games without defeat behind them.

Some complaints have been received from supporters who watch the games from the Bobbers Stand about people pushing through their ranks to get to the other end of the ground. We tried to combat this nuisance by building a fence but this has been smashed and it is difficult to find a solution.

However, we do appeal to those who are causing the trouble to desist because this is a case of the majority spoiling things for the majority.

Finally, we would repeat that season ticket holders will not have to pay for their seats at the re-arranged match with Watford, but will be able to use a spare ticket in their books.

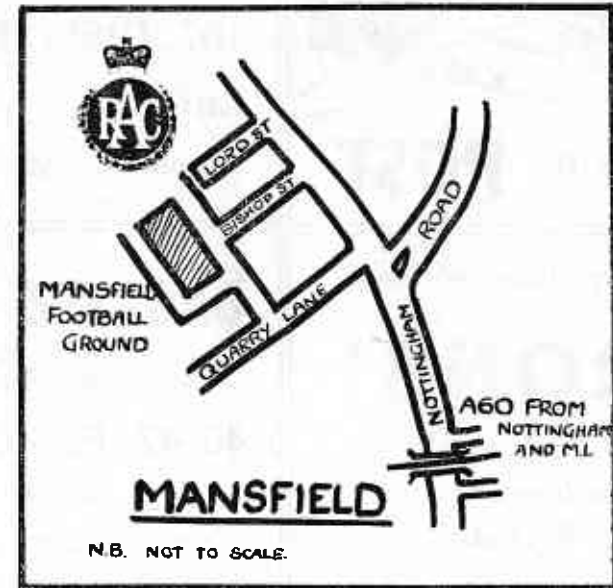

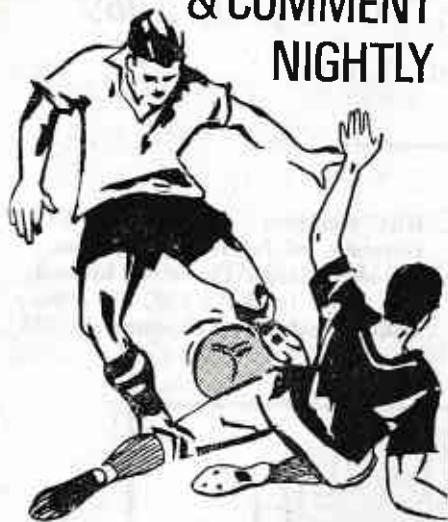

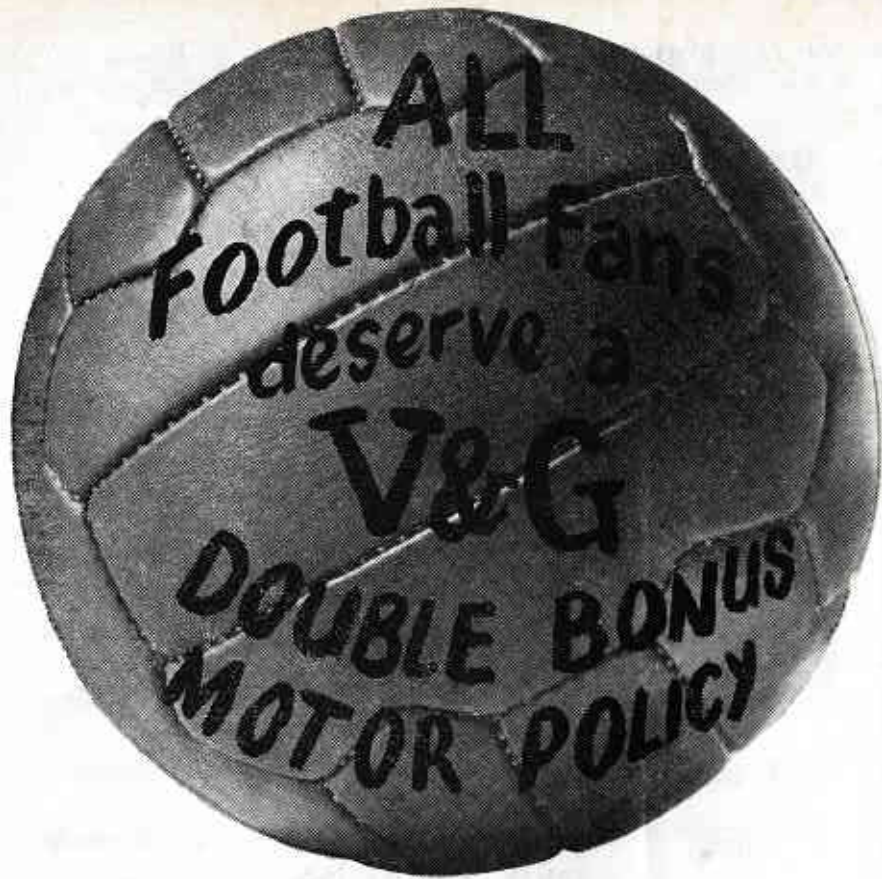
