CLUB NOTES

WHILE the Easter programme proved to be a good deal less satisfactory than we hoped for, and the promotion chance does not look so bright as we expected it would, the fact remains that we have by no means given up hope.

Five more matches remain, including the one with Brighton this afternoon, and there must be an all out attempt to secure as near maximum points as possible and so keep the outside chance alive.

That means beginning today with a convincing win over Brighton who, however, have improved considerably since we caused their exit from the League Cup by 4-2 in a replay on September 11th.

Previously, we had drawn 1-1 at Brighton and in the League game, which was also in September, we went down by the only goal.

There was, of course, acute disappointment at the failure to beat Southport on Tuesday evening when we just could not break down the blanket defensive tactics used by the visitors.

That caused us to draw the first blank at home so far as goals are concerned this season but the unbeaten home record which now extends to 21 League matches was never in danger. Unfortunately this match caused our injured list to increase, with Sandy Davie and Freddie Jardine the casualties.

When the former was carried off on a stretcher, the damage looked very serious but, fortunately, no bones were broken, but he suffered severe bruising in the region of the ribs.

Jardine, for whom this has been an unlucky season, had to stay in the dressing room at half time because of a badly swollen ankle and he seemed unlikely to be available for today.

In fact, injuries in recent weeks, along with illness, have proved to be a handicap as the team made a spectacular run of 13 matches without defeat.

That was brought to an end at Mansfield on Monday when there was a below par display which contrasted sharply with the effective way in which the holiday began by taking a point from Torquay.

By the law of averages, of course, defeat had to come some time, but it was unfortunate that it should arrive just when we wanted to give our promotion drive that extra impetus.

There is no let-up in the busy period with which we have been concerned for some weeks and on Monday, comes the return match with Southport. This is followed by another trip north on Friday when we are due to meet Tranmere Rovers at Prenton Park.

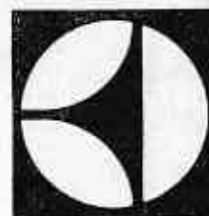

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Brian Powney (goalkeeper). Born at Seaford, Sussex. Joined the Club in September, 1961 from Seaford Secondary School. Played for East Sussex Schoolboys. Is the Albion's longest serving player with 182 First Team appearances.

Stewart Henderson (full back). Came to Brighton from Chelsea in October, 1965. Played for school team — St. Modans High School, Stirling — and for Stirlingshire Schoolboys. Won three Scottish Schoolboys Caps at right back. Born at Bridge of Allan, Scotland.

John Templeman (full back). Joined club from Portsmouth Juniors in July 1966. Captain of his school team, Westergate Secondary Modern School, near Chichester, Sussex. After leaving school was with Portsmouth Juniors for two seasons.

Bobby Smith (half back). Born at Presbury, Cheshire. Joined the Club in June, 1968 from Grimsby Town. Lived most of his life in Manchester. Played for Manchester and Lancashire Boys. Won 6 England Schoolboys Caps, and 2 England Youth Caps. Went straight from school to Manchester United. Also played for Scunthorpe United.

John Napier (centre half). Born in Lurgan, Northern Ireland. Played with Lurgan Boys Intermediate and went straight from school to Bolton Wanderers from whom he was signed by Brighton in August, 1967. Has 1 Full Northern Ireland International Cap, 2 Under 23 Caps, 11 Youth Caps, 3 Schoolboy Caps.

Dave Turner (half back). Born at Retford, Notts. Played for Nottinghamshire Schoolboys and had two trials for England Schoolboys. Joined Newcastle United straight from school from which club he signed for Brighton.

Kit Napier (inside forward). Born at Dunblane, Scotland. Played for South and East Scotland Schoolboys. Previous clubs Preston, Blackpool and Workington before joining Newcastle United from whom he was signed by Brighton in September, 1966. Last

season broke Brighton's post-war scoring record with 24 League goals, 3 League Cup goals and 1 F.A. Cup goal.

Alex Dawson (centre forward). Born Aberdeen. Joined the Club, December 1968 from Bury. Previous Clubs, Manchester United and Preston North End. Joined Manchester United straight from school and played in Youth team with Brighton skipper Nobby Lawton. First Team debut at 17. Played in 1958 Cup Final for United—with Albion manager Freddie Goodwin. Six years with Preston North End, appearing in their 1964 Cup Final team—with Nobby Lawton as captain. During 1963/64 season scored 37 goals for Preston.

Eddie Spearritt (inside forward). Born Lowestoft. Joined the Club in January, 1969 from Ipswich Town. Played for Lowestoft and Suffolk Schoolboys and joined Arsenal straight from school. After six months with the 'Gunnery' returned to East Anglia and joined Ipswich Town. Spent 5½ years with Ipswich, playing 23 First Team games during their Division Two championship season, 1967-68.

David Armstrong (winger). Born Mile End, London. Joined Club in September, 1968. Joined Millwall Athletic during December, 1965. Played for East London Schoolboys and then amateur football for Hornchurch Iford and Barking. Played as an amateur for Football Association.

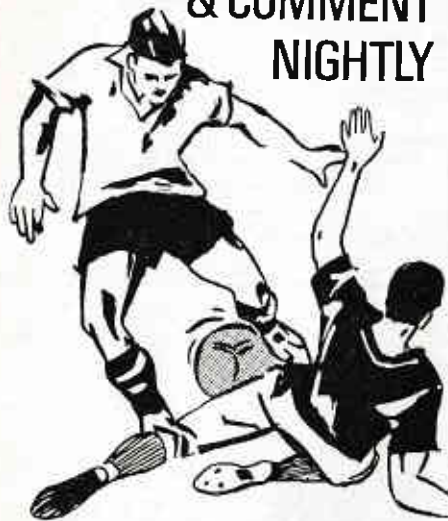

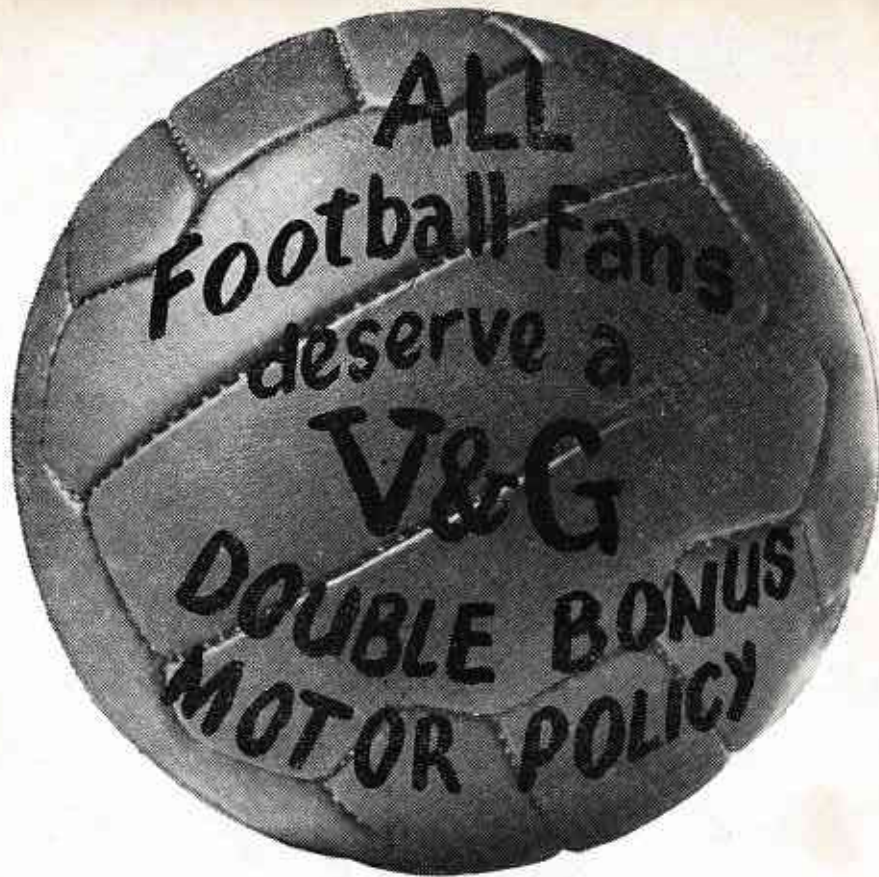
