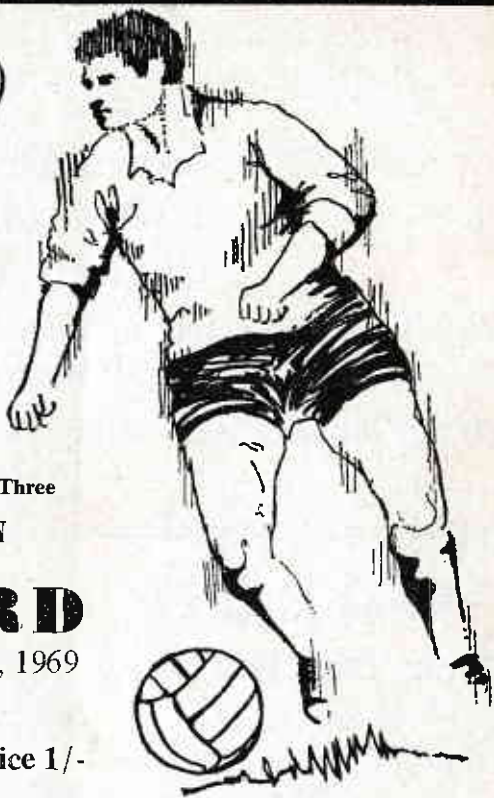
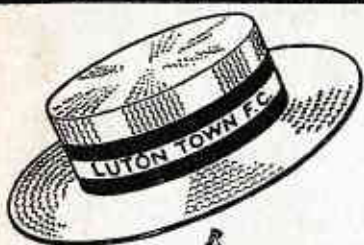

## CLUB NOTES

TONIGHT marks the end of a memorable season and there could certainly not be a more exciting climax than a tussle with our neighbours, Watford.

This is the third attempt there has been to settle this issue, the first being postponed way back on Boxing Day, and the second coming to a premature ending through snow on February 19th.

Now, Watford come wanting one point to make certain of the Third Division title, while it is absolutely necessary for us to win in order to keep alive the faint hope that we will accompany the Hertfordshire club into Division Two.

So, it all adds up to an intriguing situation, the outcome of which we expect around 25,000 to come to see.

With such a crowd expected and bearing in mind that it is always more difficult to pack adequately when there is an evening kick-off, because of the time factor, we would ask spectators to give the maximum possible assistance to the stewards, whose numbers have been reinforced for this occasion.

If everyone is helpful and carries out the directions of the stewards, there is no reason why all those who want to see the game should not do so in comfort.

This is a special occasion for both clubs and we would appeal for good behaviour on the terraces, especially behind the Oak Road goal where there was further trouble during the match with Stockport last Friday.

The folly of itinerant whistle blowing is now reflected in our goal average which should have been exactly the same as that of Swindon but is worse because of the irresponsible act that cost us a penalty.

Other than that, the result was eminently satisfactory, and if any extra incentive were needed tonight, it is the knowledge that the unbeaten home record still stands and that we have to go back 12 months to the last home defeat.

In closing down, we would express our grateful thanks to all those who have helped the club by their efforts this season, including stewards, gate-men, bar stewards, car park attendants—in fact everybody who has contributed to the smooth running of affairs.

Not forgetting, either, the youth teams which have been well supported by local, young players, and their team managers.

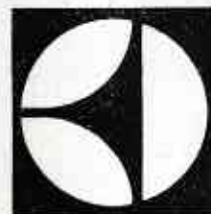

## PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

**Bert Slater.** Signed from Dundee in May 1965. In a successful career he kept goal for Falkirk when they won the Scottish Cup in 1957. Helped Liverpool back to Division 1 status in 1962 and was in Dundee's team that won through to the European Cup Semi-Final in 1963. Gained a Scottish under 23 cap against Wales in 1959. An ever present member of the First Team last season, Bert has now made 145 First Team appearances.

**Duncan Welbourne.** Joined Watford from Grimsby Town in November 1963. He was with the 'Mariners' for five seasons and helped them regain Division 2 status. Has played more First Team games for Watford than any other player on the Club's books, the total at the beginning of this season being 216.

**John Williams.** John was born in London near to 'Spurs' Ground. Signed originally as an apprentice he became a full professional in 1964 and so far has made 133 first team appearances. Did not miss a First Team match last season.

**Brian Garvey.** Brian had eight seasons with Hull City before joining Watford in July 1965. Did not miss a First Team game last season and had made 139 appearances for the Club. A qualified coach, Brian has spent most of the summer in Zambia with a party of coaches and players seeking to improve the standard of football in that country.

**Keith Eddy.** Keith became a Watford player in July 1966 after previously playing for Barrow. Last season he made 37 League appearances and 6 Cup appearances to bring his total for the Club to 95. Appointed 'skipper' of the Club towards the end of last season. His hobbies include golf and table tennis.

**Dixie Hale.** Born in Waterford, Dixie was first signed from Waterford by Swansea Town. He gained several caps for the League of Ireland. From Swansea he moved to Barrow and then on to Workington before signing for Watford in July 1967. Last season he made 48 First Team appearances and scored 6 goals.

**Stewart Scullion.** Prior to coming to Watford in February 1966, Stewart was with Charlton Athletic who signed him from Chesham United. Born in Boness, he has lived in Ruislip for

many years but moved into Watford during the summer following upon his marriage. Scored nine League goals in season 1967/68 and some of them were indeed memorable ones.

**Barry Dyson.** Born in Oldham, Barry commenced his career with Bury in 1960 and moved on to Tranmere in 1962. It was with this club that he made his reputation as a goalscorer finding the net over 100 times. He moved to Crystal Palace in 1966 and came to Watford in January 1968. During the remainder of the season he made 20 appearances and scored 15 goals to finish as leading scorer.

**Terry Garbett.** Terry came south from Middlesbrough in August 1966 and finished his first season as leading goalscorer with 18 goals. Last season he found the net on 14 occasions. So far he has made 96 First Team appearances for Watford scoring a total of 32 goals. By way of relaxation Terry is a keen fisherman.

**Tom Walley.** Tom was born in Caernarvon and after leaving school played for the local side. Spotted by an Arsenal scout he eventually joined the staff at Highbury. Tom became a Watford player in March 1967 and made 49 First Team appearances last season and continued to captain the Welsh under 23 eleven. Was also selected as reserve for Wales in the full International against West Germany.

**Bernard Lewis.** Transferred to Watford from Cardiff City in November 1967 for whom he signed professional terms in 1963. He played nearly 100 cup and League games for the 'Bluebirds' including European Cup matches. He has won 5 under 23 caps for his native Wales.

**Brian Owen.** Brian came to Watford as an amateur, became an apprentice and finally a full professional. He gained an England Youth cup against Switzerland in 1963. Although only 23, he has served the Club longer than any other player at present with the Club. In his spare time he is studying to become a physiotherapist.

**Brian Endean** (inside forward). A new comer to Watford who joined the Club in September, 1968 from the Pelton Fell Workmans Club. He recently made his debut in the First Team and has created a very good impression.

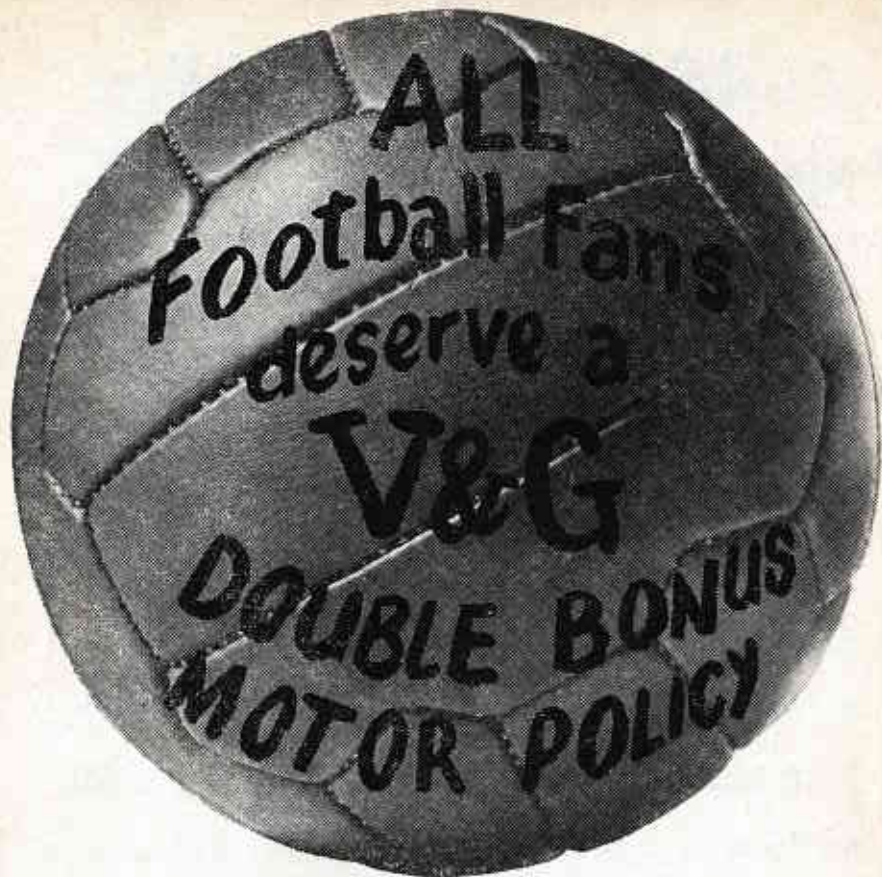

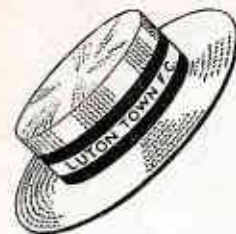
