With the League programme scheduled to end earlier than ever before because of England's commitments in the World Cup, there are extra stresses on teams in the next few months.

Particularly will this be the case for those who are fortunate enough to make progress in the League Cup in which the Town begin next Wednesday with a visit to Peterborough United.

This is something that will not be undertaken lightly because, although Peterborough are a division lower and had a disappointing time last season, they

will certainly not be easy to beat on their own well-appointed ground.

Draw Would Do

Doubtless, there will be satisfaction in the Luton camp if they can finish on level terms and stage a replay at Kenilworth Road on the following Tuesday.

Supporters will have noticed that all home mid-week matches this season will be played on Tuesdays.

This is thought by Manager Alec Stock and coach Jimmy Andrews to be the day of the week that causes less disruption of the training programme and



the theory is that supporters will not mind seeing their football a day earlier than they are used to.

The manager has also had some success in persuading the clubs that have to be visited in mid-week to stage their matches on Tuesdays.

Exception

Only exceptions are the away games with Reading and Fulham which will be on Wednesdays and, of course, the League Cup-ties.

make progress to the glamour rounds of the now highly successful League Cup, no one is going to forget that the prime aim of the club this season is to secure promotion to the Second Division.

That is a position which is more in keeping with the club's reputation and traditions.

After the near miss last season when the team made a tremendous finish which was not quite good enough to remedy the lack of away success before Christmas, Luton must be one of the favourites for the big prize.

Manager Stock, however, it too old a campaigner to take anything for granted and he knows full well that it will be a long and arduous struggle.

On the face of things, the Town should get off the mark today with a victory over Barrow who fell away after being one of the front-runners in the early part of last season.

Avoided Drop

So badly did they falter that, at one time, there was a distinct possibility that they would suffer the drop but, in the end, they avoided this and they have been doing some judicious team-building during the summer.

However, their record on this ground cannot be too encouraging to them because they are still looking for their first point here and, on their last visit, crashed by 5–1.

Obviously, many people will be waiting to see how the Town will fare without Bruce Rioch whose transfer to Aston Villa was one of the big stories of the close season.

Naturally, the club are convinced that their action was correct and that their promotion chance will not be affected.

In point of fact, unless there has been some dramatic transfer news in the last

few days since these notes were written, it can be taken for granted that the manager has not yet completed the complement of players which he feels is necessary.

The Priority

Two more forwards are his priority, but, rightly, he has not rushed into the transfer market, but is waiting until the players who he thinks will fit in here are available.

Obviously, he has the men he needs in mind, but it is so easy to make a mistake in football and he can afford to wait for the right man and the right moment to step in.

Tough Task

On the face of things, next week is going to be an arduous one for the team. After their visit to Peterborough, they are due to meet Bournemouth next Saturday at Dean Court, a ground on which they achieved a brilliant victory last season.

Bournemouth have their own pretensions towards promotion, and this is a tough fixture with which to begin the away programme. In their task, the Town are bound to have a large following and they can use all the encouragement that comes their way.

Hectic Build-up

The pre-season build-up has been quite hectic because there have been a number of friendly matches for both teams.

The seniors came out pretty well with two victories, a draw and only one defeat, which came at Aldershot a fortnight ago when the team was somewhat below strength.

In these games, the inevitable injuries have come along, but it is hoped that near enough the first choice side would be available this afternoon.

NEW LOOK BARROW SEEK CONSISTENCY

Last November, Barrow were joint leaders of the Third Division, with a clear lead over Swindon and Watford, when they hit a spell of thirteen games without a win – the worst sequence in Third Division soccer last term. At the end they were struggling to avoid relegation.

New manager, Norman Bodell, doesn't relish another flirtation with relegation and his rebuilding plans consisted of a big clear-out at the end of the campaign.

It's possible that today we could see as many of seven close-season signings, plus two more men who linked with the club at the tail end of last season, in the side. Only time will tell if these new Barrow boys can find a winning touch and provide more consistency this season.

By far the most experienced new signing is goalkeeper George Heyes, the likely replacement for Fred Else who acted as temporary player-manager for a while last season and who is now turning his hand to administrative duties. Heyes, a one-time Bolton junior, commenced his professional career with Rochdale in the late fifties.

Banks's Understudy

Leicester were impressed and took him on in 1960. Unfortunately, Gordon Banks was then striking the form that was to make him England's first choice and George spent most of his five years at Filbert Street as understudy. A move to Swansea in 1965 gave him regular League soccer again and he made ninety-nine League appearances before leaving during the summer.

Charlie Cooper worked his way through Bolton's junior teams for his League baptism in 1960/61. For the past three seasons he had held a fairly regular place in their Second Division side at full back.

Young Signings

The remainder of Barrow's summer signings were younger players, yet to prove themselves in League soccer. Players like centre-half Geoff Street, who kicked off with Manchester City without making their first team; Southport gave him his chance in League soccer two seasons back.

Barry McArthur made a good start in First Division football with Nottingham Forest four years ago: he hit four goals in seven matches – but was never given another chance.

Billy Garbett made occasional appearances in Shrewsbury's side over the past couple of seasons but didn't manage to hold down a regular spot. Wing-halves Brian Dean (from Blackpool) and Frank Hollis (Leicester) have yet to taste League football.

Beat Deadline

Tony Morrin and Dick Davis arrived on the eve of last season's transfer deadline as Barrow fought desperately to avoid the drop.

Morrin, an inside-forward, had made occasional appearances for Stockport but hit three goals in Barrow's final fourteen League games. Davis enjoyed his first League football with Plymouth in 1962/63.

After two seasons at Southampton, Bristol City signed him in 1965 but it was only after his latest move that he begun to establish himself at senior level.

Danger Men

Danger men in attack are David Storf and Jim Mulvaney. Storf, the former Sheffield Wednesday and Rochdale winger, was top scorer two seasons back while Mulvaney, who joined Barrow from Hartlepool two years ago, took over this mantle with eighteen goals last term.

Wing-half Mike Hartland spent a couple of seasons with Oxford before joining Barrow in 1965. The only locally developed player is Brian Arrowsmith who has missed only a handful of games since his debut in 1962. Centre-half Brian needs only two more matches to chalk up 300 League appearances for the club.

No Point Yet

Barrow have yet to take a point from Kenilworth Road. Last season, on 26th March, we triumphed 5–1, goals from Brian Lewis (2), Bruce Rioch, Alan Slough and Keith Allen taking us to victory. Our full League record against Barrow is: P W D L For Ag Pts Home 3 3 0 0 11 4 6 Away 3 1 1 1 1 3 3




