

EARLY UPSET —THEN LUTON TAKE OVER

Luton 5 Peterborough 2

Luton, showing the punch that promotion is made of, swept through last night's League Cup replay after player-manager Jim Iley had given Peterborough an early lead.

Luton are now at home to Millwall in the second round on Sept. 2, which should produce a crowd of more than 20,000. The same attacking football as last night's would deserve it.

This was Luton's 30th match unbeaten at home, but their record seemed in danger at the start, with Peterborough full of enterprise, and Hall enticing Branston away from the middle.

It was from Hall's curling centre that Iley, sidestepping Bannister on the far side of the penalty area, scored with a tremendous rising drive after only eight minutes.

Constant threat

But now Luton took charge, with Sheffield and Macdonald a constant threat through the middle. It was Macdonald who equalised with a half-volley from Allen's header after 23 minutes.

Drewery, in Peterborough's goal, was clearly uncertain of himself, and he was nowhere near when Branston came up to hit the second from Lewis's corner on the half hour.

Just before half-time Lewis hit the first of two penalties, after he had been brought down by Wyle, but before he scored his second—when Hampton handled Sheffield's shot—Robson briefly gave Peterborough fresh hope by making it 2-3. In a final flourish Allen hit the fifth.
