PAVE WAY

Walsall 1 Luton Town 3

Luton's superior class justifiably earned them their fifth away win of the season. Their latest victims, lowly Walsall, seem destined for another harrowing time.

Leading the Third Division, and still unbeaten after 11 games, Luton, were indebted to Tees, who scored two opportunist goals to settle Walsall's fate. Signed from Charlton six week ago, Tees has now scored four goals in his last two matches.

He began on an impressive note with a 30-second goal, but Taylor obtained Walsall's equaliser within a minute following a short free kick by Train.

Well-taken goals

Luton, hesitant in defence in the half, did not relish Walsall's aggressive tactics, but took command in the second period. They clinched their victory with two well-taken goals at a time when Walsall threatened to get back into the game.

Walsall lacked a goal-scorer, and it was Tees who transformed the game with another fine header after 58 minutes following a Keen free kick. Ten minutes later Collins put the issue beyond doubt with another goal from a free kick, this one taken by Bannister.
