We hold third place in our League, two positions behind leaders Luton who are our visitors today.

We welcome back Alec Stock to Leyton and he brings with him the team who have been favourites since August to win a place in the Second Division.

He has helped rejuvenate this once great old club yet they have already felt the weight of our promotion challenge. Orient were desperately unlucky not to end Luton's impressive unbeaten home record on August 23 when we lead 2-0 with the match almost over.

We ended up beaten 3-2 in an incredible turnabout and

have that sensational result to avenge this morning.

It would, of course, have been a better grounding for this match had we taken the victory we deserved over Rotherham on Saturday. But the fact that we were held 1-1 does not disguise the fact that we were the better side and we remain contident of our ability to press a promotion effort.

Your confidence in our potential we reflected in the wonderful response to our Christmas Draw and I would like to thank all who took tickets as well as the organisers for a magnificent

effort.

The Supporters section have also made a valuable donation to the club from their activities. That was done at a most enjoyable staff party on Saturday evening at our Green and Silley Weir training ground.

It remains for me only to wish you all a Happy New Year in the hope that Tommy Taylor's recognition as England Youth captain will be only the first of many honours won by Orient in 1970.

LUTON TOWN E

Alec Stock, our own former manager and the man who led Queen's Park Rangers from Third to First Divisions in successive promotion seasons, is now seeking similar success for Luton. He has not only lifted them to the top of Division 111 but played a major part in the modernisations and development of Luton's facilities. The man who now enjoys the role of executive manager is expected to bring the following players with him today:

TONY READ: Former Sheffield Wednesday and Peterborough goalkeeper who has also played at centre forward and

once scored a hat-trick in a League match.

JOHN RYAN: Signed from Fulham on a free transfer in the close season after 45 first team games for the Craven Cottage club.

JACK BANNISTER: Consistent and dependable full back

who numbers among Luton's most loyal clubmen.

MIKE KEEN: Alec Stock's captain in his meteoric QPR side and did not miss a match in those two seasons. Followed his manager to Luton last season.

CHRIS NICHOL: Powerful centre half signed from Halifax for £35,000 this August as the cornerstone of Luton's promotion

effort.

ALAN SLOUGH: Sound defensive wing half and a long standing and firm favourite with Luton fans.

JOHN COLLINS: Another of Stock's signings. Picked up

from Reading this summer.

MALCOLM MACDONALD: A 19-year-old signed this summer from Fulham for £17,500. Began the season at full back but has adopted the role of striker with great success.

MATT TEES: Bought from Charlton for £20,000 the day Nichol was signed. Among the best headers of the ball in the

country. A fearless centre forward.

KEITH ALLEN: A play-anywhere performer signed from Stockport in exchange for Derek Kevan. Formerly with Portsmouth and Grimsby.

GRAHAM FRENCH: A match-winning winger who has at-

tracted scouts from all the top clubs.

BRIAN LEWIS: Former Coventry forward just recovered from injury after finishing last season as leading scorer in Luton's near-miss promotion effort.

TODAY'S REFEREE

Today it is our pleasure to welcome to Leyton Stadium the man acknowledged by football's professional players as the outstanding referee in the country.

Gordon Hill of Leicester finished way ahead in a poll of the players to nominate the most respected official — yet he only began refereeing in 1952 because his pupils accused him of not knowing the rules of the game.

Mr. Hill is headmaster of Stafford Leys County Primary School in Leicester where he lives with his wife and two young sons. He progressed through the North Regional and Central Leagues to the Football League linesmen's list in 1960 and the referees list in 1966.

He is one of the few referees who is also a qualified F.A. Coach and his understanding of the problems of players is no doubt a major factor behind the respect he now enjoys in Soccer.
