

Today we welcome Luton to Plain-moor and, naturally, this is one game which I would particularly like us to win, firstly to earn two points for the club and to follow up the good result achieved earlier in the season when we took a point off Luton on their own ground. So a win this afternoon would give me a lot of personal satisfaction, even though I had a hand in taking most of the Luton players to Kenilworth Road.

Over a year has gone by since my arrival here and I have gone back to Luton many times to review some of the players and maintain contact with most of the directors of the club.

Only two weeks ago I had to appear as a witness for Luton Town at a Commission in London.

I shall always hold a high regard for Luton, mainly because it was the club which gave me my start as a Manager in League football and also because I had four happy years there as a player, culminating in an appearance at Wembley in the FA Cup Final.

Looking at Luton's current staff, Sandy Davie, in the goal, was bought from Dundee United at a fee in the region of £8,000 and I felt he was a very good acquisition at the time. Since then the club has been approached to sell him at a gain.

Fullback John Ryan was a free transfer from Fulham who has fitted in very well since Maxie Dougan has had to go

BABBACOMBE SEA FRONT Telephone 37561 into hospital to have a cartilege out. From friends at Luton I hear that Maxie is getting on fairly well. Jack Bannister, the left fullback, has been a regular this season and is a competent player.

Mike Keen, who was bought from Queens Park Rangers by Alec Stock for a fee in the region of £19,000 has plenty of experience as he went from the Third to the First Division with the London club.

Centre half Chris Nicholl was bought from Halifax at a fee of about £35,000 and has made the position his own since the semi-retirement of that old war horse Terry Branston.

Alan Slough, the left half, is a local product, coming from the schools and ground staff to reach a maturity that has attracted Spurs and Arsenal.

John Collins is a player well known to Mr Stock for he served with him at Q.P.R. He joined Luton from Reading at a fee of about £10,000.

Harry Haslam, who assists Alec Stock and does quite a lot of scouting for him, was the man behind the £18,000 transfer of Malcolm Mac-Donald from Fulham. This lad has scored many goals.

A very good header of the ball and the player who scored the goal which cost us a point at Luton is centre-forward Matt Tees, secured from Charlton Athletic at a cost of about £20,000.

Keith Allen figured in an exchange deal with Derek Kevan when Kevan went to Stockport County. I knew quite a lot about this player as he was on the ground staff at Portsmouth during my time there.

Graham French has the potential for First Division football. This player has had a chequered career. He was on the ground staff at Huddersfield, then he went to Shrewsbury where he gained International Youth Caps, was transferred to Swindon and finished at Watford before going out of League football and playing for Wellington Town. He was bought from Wellington by George Martin, the then Manager of Luton, for a very reasonable fee.

Looking back to our last home match with Barrow, I was just as frustrated at our performance as the many spectators who walked out of the ground before the end. But when spectators show their disappointment it tends to rub off on the players' performance and the slow handclap and jeering which took place did not help us.



The Men from Luton

Sandy Davey—former Scottish Under 23 goalkeeper for whom Luton paid an £8,000 fee a year ago last October.

John Ryan—close season signing from Fulham who gave him a free transfer despite the fact that he appeared 45 times in their League side in the previous two seasons. Ryan had a spell with Arsenal.

Malcolm Macdonald—another formmer Fulham player for whom Manager Stock paid £17,500.

Mike Keen—spent ten seasons with Q.P.R. and captained them from the Third to the First Division without missing a match.

Alan Slough—is a highly valued player who has signed a six year contract with Luton.

Jack Bannister—joined last October from Crystal Palace for £8,000. Had over 100 League games for Palace and previously served with West Brom and Scunthorpe.

Graham French—joined Luton from Wellington Town at a £5,000 fee.

Keith Allen—served with Portsmouth, Grimsby and Stockport before moving to Luton in exchange for Derek Kevan. Chris Nichol—big money signing from Halifax, made his home debut in September against Bristol Rovers.

Matt Tees—joined from Charlton in the same week as Nichol, lifting Luton's outlay in a seven days period to £55,000.

John Collins is another of Mr Stock's signings this season, from Reading.

John Moore—a Scot signed from Motherwell, is in his fourth season at Kenilworth Road.

At Cricketfield Road

The 1905-6 season was the United's first at Cricketfield Road. Contrary to expectations, the season turned out to be one of the best. Players came along from various towns to take up appointments in Torquay and there were by now four established clubs in the town—Ellacombe, Babbacombe, Torquay Y.M.C.A. and the United. We were still holding a prominent position in the East Devon League, to which we remained true despite many suggestions that we should transfer to the Plymouth district.

The ground at Cricketfield Road was one of the best I have ever played on. The turf was perfect and being situated some feet above the level of the road with a fairly high hedge, it was an ideal little enclosure. The pitch, however, was only 150 yards long and 60 yards wide. On the opposite side to the road there was a natural grandstand, the field sloping almost to the extent of one-in-seven.

But we were not destined to stay there long. The builder was branching out in that direction and in less than twelve months we were again "under notice". I remember making it my business, during the three years we were there, to try to get the Council interested in the purchase of the land. The price was not an exorbitant one and the town would have at least secured a really first-class ground at a reasonable figure.

But Torquay Town Council in those days was a vastly different body from to-day. Little or no consideration was given to the sporting side of the town's life and I was constantly told that the ground was too far out to be of real value. Of course, there were no 'buses or trams and perhaps those in authority did not realise the transport advances which would be made.

We had enough players to run a third eleven, and on occasions we did so, but the ground difficulty was again confronting us. It meant that we could not guarantee players having more than one Saturday in three at home so after one season the third eleven was dropped. Early and late in the season we often had a field day and played two, and occasionally three, games on a Saturday, starting at 2 pm and ending at about 6.30 pm.

READING, currently topping the Third Division, can point to a disappointing F.A. Cup defeat as the turning point of their season. For, like Torquay, they were knocked out of the Cup by non-League opponents-Brentwood Town. But since that bitter blow Reading have surprised many with their advance up the Third Division table. An unbeaten run of 13 games has lifted them from 18th position in November to the top of the table. But many Reading fans believed the club had lost their chance of promotion when they sold winger Tom Jenkins to Southampton for £60,000. Everyone agreed it was a nice fat fee to receive for a player who had originally cost £1,500 and they resigned themselves to another season of mediocre success. But then manager Jack Marshall signed young George Cumming from Arsenal for £7,000 and Read ing started climbing up the table to their present lofty position.

IN THE LAST FIVE YEARS Rochdale have had to apply for reelection twice. And in the season before last they finished sixth from bottomwhen another re-election plea could well have been their last. But just look at Rochdale now. In their first season back in the Third Division they are now challenging hard for promotion. Manager Len Richley is as pleased as anybody with the club's success. The secret, says Richley, is that they have impressed on their players that the 4-2-4 playing system is an attacking formation. "The object of this formation is to score goals not to think about preventing them," he added.

ROTHERHAM MANAGER Jimmy McAnearney has finally got his man—after trying to sign him for most of the season. The player in question? Full-back Billy Houghton, who has been signed from Leicester City for £4,000. McAnearney and Houghton used to play together with Watford.

EARLY-SEASON pacesetters Luton Town are yet another Third Division club to invite a celebrity from the world of entertainment to join their board of directors. Eric Morecambe (he's the tall, thin one with glasses) from the Morecambe and Wise comedy team joined their board last month. Already Fulham have comedian Tommy Trinder as their chairman, while Brighton have Norman Wisdom on their board.

WHAT'S IN A NAME? Luton have recently added a 20-year-old forward to their payroll. He is Viv Busby, who showed great promise as an amateur with Isthmian League side Wycombe Wanderers. Busby has given up his job as a senior cost clerk for a football career. The club are now hoping that he will be as successful as that other Busby—Sir Matt.

REMEMBER Plymouth Argyle winger, Dave Corbett? Dave had to quit the game two years ago after twice breaking a leg. Now Plymouth have arranged a testimonial game for him at Home Park on March 2 against Leicester City.

WHEN Bournemouth entered the Football League 47 years ago they were admitted to the Third Division South. They have been playing Third Division football ever since. But a poor playing record and a spate of injuries this season has endangered their status this season. If, in fact, they were to drop they would be the last League side to have stayed at the same level since joining.

CRISIS CLUB WALSALL, who are still losing £400 a week and have an outsize £80,000 overdraft to clear, were involved in fresh talks with the Town Council this week. Walsall's financial problems have not been helped by postponements due to bad weather. Their last three games, two at home, have been called off and until last Monday the team had not played for 20 days.


