There was a good deal more merit in Luton's second goal, after 54min. when Mike Keen sent McDonald on a lone road to goal and he sent a controlled shot wide of Harker.

A clever lob by Joe Ashworth gave Jenkins the chance to score for Rochdale with a diving header eight minutes later.

With young David Cross leading the line with great promise and resource Rochdale might have got an equaliser but instead collected a black mark when Colin Parry was booked near the
