Malcolm MacDonald's 69th minute goal wiped out Forest's 16th minute lead, a first score for ex-Montrose winger, Jimmy McIntosh in only his third senior game.

MacDonald's first thump at goal was blocked by a defender, but he took the rebound well for his 20th goal of the season.

Awkward

attacks in a late rally but their effort came too late.


Saves by active Tony Read and his colleagues continued the Forest frustration which has lasted 11 matches without a win.

Substitute Ronnie Rees was brought on but the Forest marksmanship was not clever enough.

Brave Peter Cormack played almost a lone hand with little support and the well-composed Luton defence snuffed out all his efforts, barring flying headers which went over the top.

There was no difference in class once Luton had gained surety in defence and positive action up front.

Then more open approach work contrasted with the Forest policy of bunching in the middle.
