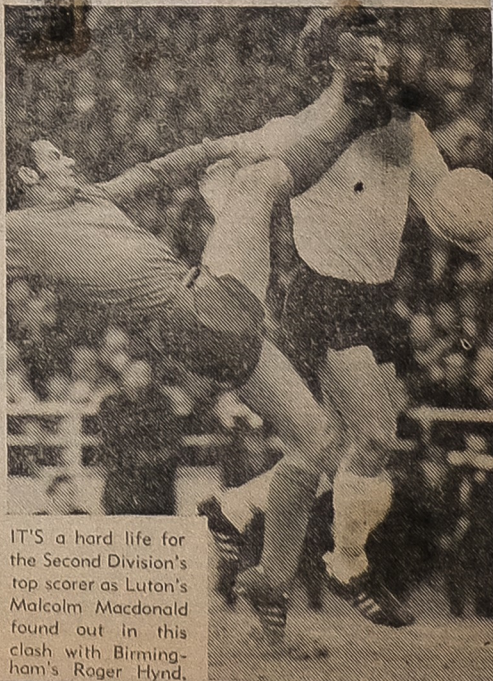
Luton 3, Birmingham 2
