

Golden Garland boosts Bristol

Bristol City 3, Luton 2

THREE goals in six minutes boosted relegation-battling City—and jolted Luton's promotion ambitions.

Chris Garland was the hero of City's fighting comeback with two goals in a minute to send Luton—who were two up at half time — hurtling to a shock defeat.

The 18,846 crowd gave City a

tumultuous ovation at the finish and manager Alan Dicks said: "The lads really showed what they were made of by getting off the floor to win. What a performance!"

Luton manager Alec Stock commented: "This was a bitter disappointment. We let them off the hook and paid the full penalty.

Easter games—against Millwall and Leicester."

Luton looked certain winners as clever Viv Busby and hot-shot Malcolm MacDonald shot them ahead with goals in the twenty-second and forty-third minutes.

Busby's right-foot volley—from MacDonald's cross—was in the back of the net before City goalkeeper Ray Cashley could move.

City fought back and made frenzied efforts to equalise that goal before the lively MacDonald

jumped in as Cashley blocked a John Ryan drive to notch his twenty-seventh goal of the season.

City's revival started in the sixtieth minute — through strong man centre half Dickie Rooks.

A Garland header hit a post and Rooks was there to hammer in the rebound.

Real Tonic

His goal proved a terrific tonic to City — and five minutes later they shook Luton by equalising and then going ahead inside a minute.

The first goal came when winger Les Wilson, on loan from Wolves, crossed for Garland to score.

The cheering had barely died away when Wilson sent over another fine centre which the all-action Garland slammed into the roof of the net.

City, their tails up, remained on top to the end.
